THE PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION. Sunday having been fixed as the day on which the two Honses of Con-

gress were to meet together and, after revising the returns of the elections in the several provinces, proclaim the President and Vice-President elect of the Republic, a dense crowd invaded all the approaches to the portion of

the building destined for the public from an early hour, and a compact mass of people obstructed the principal entrance, and but for the presence of the guard of honor the Congressmen could with difficulty have obtained an entrance. The inside of the house was seldom seen so full, and, with the exception of the diplomatic box, which was unoccupied during the whole proceedings, there was not a nook or a corner that was empty. Whether the elections of electors of the 12th April should be considered separately from those by said electors of President and Vice-President on the 12th June-which was negatived by 51 against 14; 2nd Whether the validity of the elections of electors, and those made by the electors, were to be discussed-which was also negatived, by 47 against 18; and, 3rd. Whether the absolute majority laid down by the Constitution, as necessary to make valid the election of President and Vice-President, was to be computed on the votes that should be declared valid by Congress, and not on the total votes of the Re public-which was carried, by 48 against 17.

The Secretary of the Senate then proceeded to draw by lots the names of four members to form the committee of revision and the following names were drawn: Senator Uriburu. and Deputies Valles, Gamza and Frias who sat down at a table in the centre of the house and proceeded to read aloudithe 'actas' from the several provinces as they, were handed to them by the President, the two secretaries of the Chamber of Deputies, D. Rufino Varela and D. Ramon Muñoz. noting them in two large sheets of paper. Finding game so scarce, the boy was The invitation of Mr. William White sent home, and we cantered on to visit some of the other stations I had not yet seen, the weather throughout being beautifully fine, clear sunshine. a fine bracing breeze, and the effect most exhilirating. There are some curious collections of rocks about, mostly on the margin of the streams, huge boulders, thrown up apparently by some convulsion of nature, out of which trees and enormous cactuses have formed their way through the stones, in cases splitting the boulders and presenting a singular appearance. About Mr. Giffard's quinta there is quite a large formation of this kind, and a collection of very large ombu trees, some with enormous trunks and evidently of great age. To-day, the last of my visit, has been spent riding about the quinta, watching the operation of lassoing and bringing into the corral a refractory bull and a cow that had taken into their heads to leave their companions and stray for several miles away. The dexterity of the peons, and the way they manage their horses, on these occasions, is something wonderful, and fairly exhausts the strength, of the animals. This is the finest season of the year in these countries, nor is it possible to imagine anything more pleasing or more cheerful than the aspect of the campo. The next two or three months is the winter season, with cold and rain, September and October [their spring] being also generally fine. The heat of summer is, of course, considerable, but not so much felt in the open country, with a fresh breeze generally prevailing: it is the towns that are most disagreeable at that period. To-morrow I return to Colonia, highly pleased with all I have seen, and with the kind hospitality I have met with. As I have said, partridges are very abundant, but they generally go singly, and without a pointer are difficult to follow, but Mr. White shot two brace close to his house, when we were walking out before breakfast. and several single ones on the other occasions when we were out. They are prettily marked birds and delicate eating. He did not happen to have a suitable dog by him at the time. 
