

LATEST FROM EUROPE.

CAPT. BRUCE'S NEW STEAMER.

THE FRENCH MAILS ANTICIPATED. Our old friend Capt. Bruce has beaten the French mail and favoured us with Lisbon papers to July 28th., from which we take the following important news:--

GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND Parliament is discussing the Scotch and Irish Reform bills. The Queen is going to Switzerland, accompanied by Lord Stanley. Parliament has voted Sir R. self up in Humaita, a fortress as impregnable as Fort Sumpter, which the United States could not take for three years. Did the rebels of the South deserve the sympathies of humanity because they heroically defended Fort Sumpter? And yet the defender of Fort Sumpter were North Americans. while the defenders of Humaita are Englishmen whom Lopez brought from Europe to construct the fortress and to defend it in case of bad luck in the war of conquest which he was about to undertake. The English government sent a commission to set free those Englishmen who were defending Lopez against their will, and Lopez resisted delivering them up, as is known by the documents presented to Parliament. Lord Stanley declared that England would not make war, perhaps because the same question was pending with Abyssinia. It would be well if the "Advertiser" would read the account of the voyage of Captain Page to Paraguay, in order to see what the government of Lopez is, and what is the blind submission of the Paraguay

The "Advertiser" thinks Paraguay will be ruined before Lopez will surrender, and here it is right. 


