By a mistake yesterday, we stated that the Senate had modified the project presented by the Chamber of Deputies. Far from this-it has accepted technically the bill, which has already passed the Executive as law.

Art. 1. The Senate and Chamber of Representatives authorise the Executive to permit the establishment of tramways in the streets of this city, under the following conditions:-

1. The company which solicits the establishment of a tramway shall accompany the petition with a plan of the streets through which it is to run, expressing the form and lie of the rails, the quality of the materials to be employed in the construction, the date on which the works are to be begun and terminated, specifying the points of starting and terminus, interinediate stations, &c.

2. The freight and passenger tariff shall also be expressed, and no augmentation of these charges can take place for one year after the inauguration.

3. The Company will have to keep in good repair the pavement of all those streets through which it passes and in such unpaved thoroughfares as the rails may pass through, the Company will have to pave or macadamize between the rails, and five-tenths

4. The line will be constructed at one side of the street and at a distance of the pathway, when this has less than ten metres in width, and in the middle of same when the street is wider. 5. The distance between the rails


