#### THE WIDE GAUGE.

B. Ayres, October, 1868.

In the hope that a few remarks in regard to the question about the gauge of railways in this Republiclately raised in the "Tribuna," as well as in the "Standard"-may be of some use towards assisting the public in forming its opinion, I beg you to receive the following lines as an effort to save us from the serious inconve the second I suppose is still on the way to day. niences which a reduction of the guage of railways, to be constructed, would another received by me a few days produce without any commensurate advantages being obtained.

It is not the first time that this question has been raised, nor is there anything new in the system, because many years ago locomotives were used in Wales even on a 2-foot gauge. But to give a practical idea of this question it is necessary to look on it in a true, practical light; let us see:

First. If the system of narrow guages in itself deserves merit.


