

To the Editors of the Standard. Gentlemen,

In your paper of the 20th appears an article, headed " Waterworks and a comparison between two of the proposals presented to the Municipality being that of Dr Blancas', and the other Robinson and Co.'s, in which the writer shews a saving to that corpoproposal of "forty-seven millions two hundred and fifty thousand hard dol-

Allow me to place before the public a little more clearly the difference between the two proposals, but previous to doing so, permit me to make a few observations.

We will not quarrel with the writer respecting the number of houses existing at present in the 400 central manzanas, which is put down at 16,000, and that during the ensuing five years there will be an additional 1,000, making a total of 17,000, but so far as the increase being estimated at 300 per annum, it appears to us very

AUSTRALIAN SEEDS FOR LA PLATA

(Mr. Neill's Report for September.)

The Montevidean Consul General in London varies his monthly meat missive on this occasion by the announcement of a valuable contribution of Australian tree and shrub seeds for the use of the Banda Oriental, for which they are peculiarly suitable, and can not fail to be of immense importance to the whole region of La Plata. It appears that, at the instance of Mr. E. Wilson, founder of the Acclimatization Society, and of whose good offices for the benefit of Uruguay Mr. Neill has often spoken already, Dr. Mueller, the erudite and enthusiastic curator of the Melbourne Botanical Gardens, has made an extensive and varied collection, described as consisting chiefly of some of the leading timber trees of Australia, which have been shown, by experiments in the colony, to be the most easily grown. In addition, there is a very large variety of the seeds of shrubs and trees of useful and ornamental kinds, and consisting, not only of species indigenous to Australia, but of species imported there which have been grown so successfully under the care of the Government botanist as to have perfected their seeds, and thereby proved themselves adapted to corresponding climates throughout the world. These latter have been selected under the superintendence of the Government botanist, Dr. F. Mueller, who now presents them with the wish of introducing a large range of new and beautiful objects into different parts of the world. He says that seedlings of Australian plants do not very readily transplant, and therefore it would be desirable that they should be sown in the places in which they are to grow. Some might be sown singly in garden pots, so as to admit of transplantation without breaking the roots; but if simply raised from the nursery bed with a spade the result would probably be disappointing. In introducing trees like these, particularly such as are of a larger growth, and upon as grand a scale as is calculated to alter the appearance of the country, and even to affect the climate itself, the object should be to rear a sufficient number stages to their mature and reproductive out after the summer heat, the young of specimens through their tender condition, trusting for further distribution to natural causes, such as the birds, the streams, and the winds: Probably the best mode of doing this with the present collection would be. to deeply plough a piece of enclosed to the camels! 




