All the papers are filled with the most afflicting details, and the 'leaders' of our European colleagues show the widespread sympathy which is entertained abroad for the ruined survivors on the shores of the Pacific.

Yesterday the transandine mail brought us further details, which we publish to-day. No more appalling chapter has ever appeared in print. We commend it to the attention of our readers. Since the catastrophe of Antioch, history affords nothing that can be compared to this Pacific disaster: and yet, although we have the most terrible evidence of the utter misery, ruin, and starvation which exists in Peru and Ecuador consequent on the earthquake, what steps have been taken in this city for relief?

When the news first arrived here, a committee was formed to collect subscriptions, and measures were adopted to help the sufferers. But now some two months have elapsed, and as yet not a dollar has been remitted to help the unfortunates!

There is no more charitable people under the sun than the inhabitants of Buenos Ayres: We have subscriptions for every object, benefits for every purpose; and bazaars even to increase the funds. For the last few years we had such systematic appeals on behalf of the Invalidos, that the public has lost faith in the cause, and become disgusted with the very charity. The Japanese benefit for the Invalidos was the first decided expression of public opinion in this regard. CARRANQUI AND IBARRA. The reverend Father Aguilar writes as follows from Carranqui :---

"The whole of the road from Otavalo to Ibarra is sown with ruins and the dead; and fissures and crevices in the earth are frequent; especially along the western cordillera of Mojanda as far as San Lorenzo. On the slopes of the Curchoca, besides landslips, enormous clefts have opened, or the old ones have increased in size; and the roads that communicate with the towns and farms of the western side, are intransitable, in consequence of being split up by wide and deep ravines. 'The banks of the Ambi have given

way, carrying with them plantations of sugar-cane and even habitations the formidable masses of stone and earth that have fallen from the cordillera of Cotacachi, descended as far as the plains, covering everything with ruins and desolation. From the Imbarbura; on its norther slope, a torrent of mud gushed out, which has formed small hills and destroyed some pasture fields in Ibarra, several head of cattle also perishing. To this inundation of mud succeeded a smaller one of water, which is daily increasing. ter are noted. "We yesterday arrived at this unfortunate place, after having visited the ruins of Ibarra and some of the localities where are assembled the inhabitants who have been disinterred from the midst of the 'débris.' The town is destroyed, though not so comcompletely as that of Otávalo, as a few walls are left standing, sundry ruins from four to seven metres high. of the churches, and many houses still upright, though shattered. The hou**s**es least injured are those to the southeast on the Caranqui road, but all are quero and all. ıninbabitable.

"The population of Ibarra that has escaped has been divided among many different places; but the most numerous groups are to be found in Caranquí and Lulunqui. It is now proposed to transfer all the survivors to a single point, and early this morning, I, the governor, and the commandant Peñaherrera went to look for an appropriate site; we chose a sloping plain, level and solid, to the south-east of Lulunqui, and on the margin of the Taguando, out of the direction of the wind that brings the pestilential miasma from Ibarra.
