FLAMSTEED'S MAILS.

Affairs in Spain have advanced with rapid steps during the past week, and the leaders of the revolution certainly cannot be accused of holding back in the career of change and liberal reform.

The satisfaction of the people. There is every reason to suppose that he is well acquainted with Spanish politics, and has watched the changes in the greater Peninsular kingdom until he has formed sound opinions as to its government.

Later telegrams announce that the Junta has resolved that the Colonies shall be represented by four members, and that all children born of women who are slaves, shall be declared free, their freedom to date from September 17.

With the exception of what has occurred in Spain, the past week has been an uneventful one in Europe. Nothing has occurred to revive the feelings of uneasiness as to the probabilities of war between France and Prussia, and the rumour that large reductions were about to be made in the French army has, of course, strengthened the confidence which has perhaps never been seriously disturbed.

Another consultation of physicians has been held on the case of the young Prince Royal of Belgium, and it is understood that he has made decided improvement since the last was held.

Preparations for the elections in England, which will probably take place in the middle of November, are proceeding vigorously, and candidates are busily occupied in urging their respective claims upon the new electors.

The sympathy which was everywhere expressed for the sufferers by the terrible earthquake in Peru and Ecuador has taken a very tangible form, and has resulted in large subscriptions being made for their relief.

THE EARTHQUAKE IN SOUTH AMERICA. An influential meeting of the merchants, bankers, and other citizens of London was held at the Guildhall, on October 13, for the purpose of raising a subscription for the relief of the sufferers by the earthquake in Peru and Ecuador.

The Court of Common Council had unanimously voted the use of the hall for the occasion, and the Lord Mayor had acceded to the request of the requisitionists to take the chair.

The Lord Mayor, in opening the meeting, said it had been convened at the request of a great number of influential merchants, bankers, and other gentlemen of consideration in this city, with a view of alleviating the fearful distress that had lately befallen the inhabitants of Peru and the neighbouring countries.

During the meeting several gentlemen put their names down in the subscription list, some of them giving considerable sums in aid of the object in view.

AN ENGLISH HERO AT THE BATTLE OF ALCOLEA.

There is an episode connected with the battle of Alcolea which ought not to remain unknown. Among the English engineers in the employment of the Andalusian Railway Company there is a man who first came out in the capacity of an engine-driver, but who, owing to his intelligence and good conduct, was subsequently promoted to the head management and superintendence of the locomotive department.

RUMOURD RELEASE OF IRISH PENITENTIARIAL PRISONERS.

A statement has been made that the government had ordered the discharge of six of the Fenian convicts confined in Dartmoor Prison. The only name mentioned in connection with this act of clemency, or stroke of business in a political way by Mr. Disraeli, as the case may be, is that of Edward Brophy, who, it will be remembered, was arrested at Sandymount, Dublin, in September, 1865, in connection with James Stephens.

POLICE REFORM.

We live in an age of reforms—but among all those that have been mooted, or are likely to be proposed, none is more urgently called for than a sweeping reform in the system and organisation of our Police force.

If this state of things is allowed to go on much longer, Buenos Ayres, that has hitherto boasted of a peaceful population, will acquire an unenviable reputation, the perspective of which may well frighten its inhabitants, and which is not likely to promote the so much-needed immigration to these shores.

What does not public opinion raise its all powerful voice?—or why does its great organ, the Press, allow such things as the murder of peaceful, offensive citizens on the very steps of their own doorways to pass almost unnoticed? Surely such occurrences might afford a better theme for writing about than the peculiar color of President Sarmiento's slippers, or the price General Mitre pays for his cigars.

What we want is, that the police department be placed upon a respectable and efficient footing, a task which a little energy will easily accomplish, by following the example set by England and the United States, the only countries that can be said to understand thoroughly the principles and practice of political and individual liberty.

We believe that the men to whom are now confided the destinies of the country are animated by the best intentions, and that both President Sarmiento and Governor Castro are fully alive to the great importance of this question, but we earnestly call upon our colleagues in the press of all colors and every nationality to join the cry for a thorough police reform.

MONTEVIDEO.

A new speculative era would seem to be approaching, for I hear of the formation of several new companies, amongst others "El Fomento de las tres Cruces," formed for the purpose of buying up building lots, and erecting houses thereon; its capital is \$220,000 m.p.; and another at Maldonado, for any and every purpose conducive to the advancement of the town.

The funeral service for the eternal rest of General Flores, was largely attended, and whether it was meant as a personal tribute to the memory of the deceased General, or an approval of his political career, the concert was certainly imposing, and the effect of the crowded church and mourning decorations most impressive.

The "Sociedad de Salubridad," in appreciating its endeavors, has turned sulky, and "non possumus" is now the order of the day; the reason assigned, I believe, for the neglect of various matters calling for immediate attention, being the old cry, want of funds.

"La Belle Helene" is announced for tomorrow night at the Franco-Oriental. It is the first time, I think, it has ever been performed here, and the reputation of its author, and somewhat probable character of the plot, will probably render it a favorite with our public.

The lessee of the San Felipe Theatre has given it free to the Spanish amateurs, who are about giving a performance, with the object of raising money to present General Prím and Brigadier Opete with marks of their sympathy and approbation. I dare say the idea will be a success, for there are a great many sympathisers with Spain here.

Tait is said to be in treaty with the English Government, for the carrying of an additional mail between London and these ports. If it should be carried out it will be a great facility for our commercial men.

ARGENTINE MAGAZINES.

We have been favored with the latest numbers of the three periodicals which appear monthly in this city, and are glad to find them as full as ever of useful information; indeed it is difficult to know which to recommend most, all are so interesting.

It is not always that the best and most approved works are attainable to the million; nor does it often happen that persons can enter into the style, or even have the patience to follow the author through his long tale or intricate argument, and therefore has that light, trashy class of books, whose best recommendation is a showy cover, acquired such universal patronage.

The September number just issued contains under the heading, "Memoria Militar," the conclusion of Señor Friarte's plan for the overthrow of the tyrant Rosas. The document dated Montevideo, October 1st, 1846, is ably drawn up, though subsequent failure proves its faults.

The "Recuerdos Historicos," by Sr. Varela, is but the recital of all the intestine troubles which befall this country from the time of independence, the 25th of May, 1810, until the remodelling of the Constitution in 1853.

"And then the lover sighing, like furnace, with a wall'd ballad to his mistress' eyebrow." Such is the tone of Mr. Sarroll's amorous outpouring, which is short and well written, and we can only regret not being acquainted with the fair being who merits such adulation.

Colonel Don Quintin Quevedo, special Minister to these Eastern States from Bolivia, is the subject of a lengthy notice. Commencing in the year 1860, when being taken in arms against the authorities of his native country, he was tried by court martial and sentenced to be shot, escaping death on this occasion with his usual good luck.

The remaining pages contain an account of a trip across the Andes. Like most travellers, the writer is no stranger at wielding the pen, and the description of his travels will be eagerly devoured by the romantic. To such of our readers who recommend the perusal, though top like what we published last month to bear reproduction in our columns. This strange coincidence we are inclined however to attribute rather to the monotonous character of the journey than to the plagiaristic propensities of the author.

THE REVISTA ARGENTINA.

Has the long discourse pronounced by Don Santiago Escada in Chivilcoy, on the occasion of Mr. Sarmiento's visit to that town. The eloquent speaker warmly advocates popular education, and concludes by holding out a glorious future to the country, under the new Administration.

For want of room, we suppose, Don Hector Varela, and the others who took part in the literary conference, do not appear here. The result of this battle of words is not even given, though we believe science maintained its supremacy. In place of Mr. Sarmiento's address to the meeting, we find a heavy paper on, "The Universities and Colleges of the United States," by Mr. George C. Mann.

Respecting a statement we recently published about the Prince Albert, we have received the following rectification:—"You assert that Mr Krabbe holds a power of attorney from the owner of the cargo to claim from Government. This is not the case. Mr. C. does hold a power of attorney (not from the owner, but from the shipper) to claim the amount of invoice for the assignees of the estate of Henry de Hano Wright and Co. Thus the amount claimed, if paid, will go to the estate of said firm for the benefit of all the creditors, which is but just, as the freight out and advance on up-river freight was paid by them. The coals delivered has been paid by the Government, the assignees giving a receipt under protest."

The fore-wheels of the engine were only knocked off the line, and, as regards the train, this was the only mishap that occurred. There were very few passengers, and they suffered nothing, save a sensational twinge to their nervous system. We believe the horses were the property of a poor man, named Mendoza, whose son, to whom the accident is attributed, was immediately conducted to the Police.
