gland have not made any alteration in

the rate of discount.

£60,763,000.

gold, Consols yesterday remained

without alteration throughout the day.

The fact that money is abundant in the

Stock Exchange at 1 to 1½ per cent.

being sufficient to indicate that the

question of an advance in the discount

market is at all events not urgent.

The application for a settlement and

quotations for the Italian Tobacco

Loan is to be considered by the Stock

Exchange Committee on Monday next.

prises. The contractors of the Charkof

Azof Loan have also applied for

settlement and quotation, and Mon-

day is appointed for its considera-

tion.

The Sardinian Railway Company

have presented a memorial to the

Committee of the Stock Exchange re-

questing them not to grant a settling

day for the Italian Tobacco Loan.

The new law on public meetings has

given much dissatisfaction to the De-

mocrats particularly, and even the

moderate party complain.

Twenty-four hours' notice must be

given to Government of the object,

time, and place of meeting.

The meeting loses its legitimate and

pacific character when any body com-

posing is armed.

The object for which the meeting

has been called must terminate with it,

and no after action resulting from it

can be allowed to be taken.

All and every law or ordinance to

the contrary is set aside by the pres-

ent decree.

The country is tranquil throughout,

and up to the present civil war has

been avoided.

Negotiations have been opened for

concluding peace with the Pacific Re-

publics, and the Mexican Republic has

been recognised by the Provisional

Government.

The pensions granted to the widows

and orphans, the blind and sick,

amongst the Royal household will still

continue to be paid.

The whole Spanish press has scouted

the proclamation published by Juan

de Bourbon in Paris.

The Throne has now been declared

vacant.

The Household, the Royal Chapel,

the King's military household, the

offices of Chamberlain, Doctors, &c.,

have all been suppressed.

A new commercial treaty is about

to be signed between France and

Spain.

for a revision of the treaty of Paris.

of the 'Tagblatt,' that it is proposed to

proclaim the independence of the Da-

nubian principalities, to be without

foundation. The 'France,' in denying

the first mentioned report, adds:—

'We should insult the French Govern-

ment if we allowed it to be supposed

that the French would permit any

clause of the treaty of Paris to be ques-

tioned.'

RUSSIA.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 12th

An imperial ukase has been issued

to-day ordering that with a view to

complete the strength of the army and

the fleet, a levy of four persons in

every thousand inhabitants throughout

the empire, the conscription to com-

mence on the 15th January, and end

on the 12th February next.

AUSTRIA.

Vienna, Nov. 12th

In yesterday's sitting of the Reichs-

rath the proposal of the Government

relative to the substitutes in the re-

serve, and also in the article in the

Army Bill in reference to the three

years' term of service in Line, were

agreed to. These proposals had been

opposed by the minority.

The 'New Free Press' of to-day

says:—'Negotiation are being carried

on in reference to diplomatic interven-

tion in Roumania. The Porte is of

opinion that in view of the difficulties

existing in the way of a common in-

tervention, on the basis of the treaty

of Paris, a modification of the said

treaty has become necessary. The

Porte is said to propose that not only

should the neighbouring states at the

Danubian Principalities, but also the

Porte itself, regain full liberty of in-

ternational action.

HUNGARY.

Pesth, Nov. 12th

In to-day's sitting of the Lower

House of the Hungarian Diet the Gov-

ernment proposals respecting the

future relations of the district of

Fiume to Hungary and Croatia were

adopted. The committee for the ex-

amination of the scheme is to consist

of four Hungarians, four Croatians,

and four inhabitants of Fiume. The

discussion on the budget takes place

to-morrow.

PRUSSIA.

Berlin, November 12,

In to-day's sitting of the Diet, a

question moved by Herr Loewe was

read, asking whether the Government

would renew the cartel convention

with Russia, which expires this year.

The Finance Minister declined to

answer the question at present on

political grounds.

Herr Loewe said he reserved to

himself the right of repeating the

question.

The 'Borsen Zeitung' says the Mi-

nister of Finance is about to conclude

an arrangement with certain banks

and banking firms of the city, by

which they would take up one half

of the railway loan of 40,000,000

thalers, approved of by the Diet, of last

session.
