## WAR IN THE NORTH.

DECLARATIONS OF PARAGUAYAN PRISONERS.

Col. German Serrano and his under mentioned companion-in-arms and misfortune, being of the few, lucky enough to escape with life from the slaughterous engagement on 11th Dec were brought before the Allied Commanders, and on being interrogated, desposed that he (Serrano) was 33 years old, unmarried, born in Asun cion, Colonel of infantry.

That, as regards the organization and destination of the Army, it con sisted of four brigades of foot, counting four battalions of eight hundred men each. Of these, one brigade no longer existed, the 2nd having been entirely annihilated in the battle of the 6th, at the bridge. Six regiments of horse, counting one

thousand each; twelve field pieces handled by one hundred and eightyfour men. This force marched from Lopez's encampment at Lomas Valentinas at 10 a.m., on the 5th, with orders to attack the enemy at the bridge. Deponent commanded on this memorable occasion as Lieutenant Colonel, winning for himself by his brevery and discretion the title of full rank, from the hands of the Marshal President. Lopez asserted that the Braziliau Army did not number over seven thousand men, and that their object in keeping close to the river was, in order to facilitate their retreat, upon which, he (Lopez) had despatched a force under Gen. Caballero, to intercept the San Antonio road, and cut them off at Potrero Baldovino. How successful these tactics were is

Poisonous tall-growing plants, such as the 'siente,' hemlock, and others, require to be carefully eradicated, as many animals are lost by feeding on them. All these, being either annuals or biennials, are to be got rid of by cutting at the time of

It would not be easy to over estimate the benefits-the actual profit Thistle, which I find so far superior to that would accrue to sheep tarmers and other estancieros by a practical application of the foregoing suggestions in respect to the judicious 'stockand systematic depasturing of estancia lands. Only a detailed study and observation will reveal the full importance that is attached to these matters. 
