should have remained stationary during the last year or two, and that they will possibly show a decrease in the present year, is not only natural under existing conditions, but desirable in a mere narrow and mercantile point of view, and the decrease disposes of overtrading so commonly adduced as a cause of stagnation. That the whole course of trade, however, between this country Great Britain should, compared with France and other countries, show an enormous relative decrease, is not by any means desirable, nor is it very easy to be accounted for. There is certainly one thing to bear in mind, that the immigration to this country is now almost exclusively, French and Italian. Since the failure of the sheep, industry, the British emigration has been checked. The old emigrants from the United Kingdom, which were principally Irish are dying off, and are being replaced by a new generation much more native than Hibernian. Upon these, as well as upon the rest of the native popupulation, the contact of Italian and French immigration will confer a taste for the newly developed continental manufacturers, both cotton vehicle. goods and hardwares. We contend, that this feature alone should secure for his scheme at least a fair trial. The carriages and rails are on the same principle as those which have proved so completely successful in Manchester, Liverpool; and many North American cities, and require a few words of explanation.

A single line of rails; on a level with the street, is all that is required, for by a contrivance, which we are about to explain, the carriages can be turned on and off the rails with the greatest facility, being equally adapted for running on the common road. Between the rails is a groove, in which runs a conducting-wheel, placed in front of the carriage, this, by an ingenious system of leverage, is placed under the instantaneous control of the driver or conductor, and can, by a slight pressure of the foot, be raised or lowered at will. When down, and in action, it serves to keep the carriage firmly on the line, and when raised the carriage can be turned off on the road or street, where it travels with the same facility as any ordinary

Taking this new scheme from every point of view, it seems, as we have before remarked, to possess advantages of an important kind over any of its predecessors; the proper paving even of the streets through which it is proposed to run it, would be an advantage, and probably afford a model worth studying to our Municipal authorities, in view of future operations of the kind.
