LATEST FROM THE MOUNTAINS. LOPEZ RECRUITING. Whatever doubts may have existed respecting the fate of Asuncion, they have been removed by the advices brought by the last steamer.

With much pleasure we hear that General Mitre sent a note to Marquis Caxias protesting against the wholesale pillage going on.

Mitre with his troops is encamped at Trinidad, a small town just outside of Asuncion, and on the line of railway hereabouts is the cemetery where rest the remains of the greatest man Paraguay produced, Carlos Antonio Lopez, the father of Solano Lopez.

The position of the encampment is extremely romantic. Not far off is the splendid quinta of Lopez, which when we visited Paraguay, was laid out with the most exquisite taste, and one of the most enchanting spots in this hemisphere.

From the cabildo of Asuncion floats the green banner of the Brazilians. The Government House in the Plaza is a fine old building dating from the time of the Jesuit Fathers.

A claque arrived at Asuncion on the 8th with news that Lopez has been to Paraguari, where there is a small force of about 2,000 men.

The Baron Triunfo died in Asuncion on Wednesday; he was completely worn out, and suffering for a lengthened time from disease.

Asuncion is a very fine city, and boasts of some very splendid buildings. The railway station would astonish the Porteños; they have nothing in Buenos Ayres equal to it.

A good deal of yerba, tobacco, and large deposits of hides were found in the city and carried off by the intoxicated soldiers.

The harbour never in the proudest days of Paraguay, was so crowded with shipping as at present, and the new Port Captain is the busiest man in Asuncion.

All the best houses are occupied by Brazilian officers. The Indians from the Chaco are now crossing over, and the streets are filled with the most filthy Indian women, who go about the city, their long hair down to their heels, and in the most perfect state of nudity.

The latest from Lopez is that he is in the mountains, where he is busy gathering men. He has all the families of Paraguay up there with him, and means to hold out to the very last.

There are 120 shops now open and doing business in Asuncion, owned by army sutlers, who are doing a roaring trade in the way of barter.

The streets are filled with soldiers, sailors, and Italian dealers. Immense deposits of tobacco and cigars have been found and thoroughly sacked.

The doors of the houses are all pulled down in the search for hidden treasure—as they say the Paraguayans always hid their silver thereabouts.

Poor Cateura, who was shot, held immense deposits of tobacco, all sacked; some 220 bales carried off, and sold for a mere song to a captain of a vessel in port.

Even in the stores the iron safes have been broken open; but almost in every case the safes were found empty.

There is not the slightest sign of the Paraguayan families returning. All the farms and quintas near Asuncion are deserted and even destitute of crops.

Four thousand Brazilians have, ere this, occupied Cuyaba, and several vessels with viveres are being despatched to Matto Grosso.

Lopez, when he fled at the Jomas, first halted at Cerro Leon, where he gathered up all he could, and made for the mountains.

Some Paraguayans who escaped from there brought to Asuncion Lopez's proclamation, and the news that he has now about 2,500 men with him.

On the 27th December, at the last battle, had Osorio or the Baron Triunfo occupied the potrero Marmol, Lopez could not have escaped. The latest dates brought down from Paraguay report Lopez in Cerro Leon and preparing to make a stand there.

Dr. Carreras was shot on the 14th Sept. The Minister of Foreign Affairs holds the official journal of that day,

in which the shooting of Dr. Carreras is certified to by the officers who witnessed the execution—is a small piece of paper, and some others were shot on the same day.

LOPEZ'S PROCLAMATION. Fellow-countrymen, After suffering a defeat at my headquarters at Piqueyry, I am now in this encampment. The enemy, almost annihilated by our heroic victory of the 21st, and the defeats it suffered till the 26th, driven to despair, came yesterday upon our lines, and the fortune of arms has been adverse to us, more owing to chance than to force of arms.

Our God wishes to try our faith and perseverance, in order that we may afterwards claim a more great and glorious mother country, and you, as myself, must be inspired by fresh courage, through the generous blood that was yesterday spilt on the land of our birth.

I am here to avenge and save my country. One reverse will not surely impose upon our spirits, and upon the self-denial of a magnanimous race. Our brave comrades who have had the misfortune of falling into the hands of the enemy will not affect their own glory and that they owe themselves to their country—far from becoming traitors they will join again our flag, and seek again their place in our ranks.

We have suffered a defeat, but the country's cause has not suffered, and its good children are organising themselves at this moment to fight with still greater decision against a relentless enemy, who has only remained master of the field in order to be more completely exterminated.

Two or three days in the district (La Carolina), wild, elevated, and barren, were sufficient for our purpose, and we were glad to turn our horses heads to the north, and visit the last mining district, previous to our return to the city.

Alter nine days absence from town we mounted on the last morning, about ten leagues off, intending to get in for breakfast. We had been half an hour on the road, accompanied by our usual band of cut throats, when we were met by another ditto, driving before him, at a gallop, a troop of mares, and apparently in a great hurry to be off towards the hills.

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The Provocador arrived yesterday morning at 10 a.m. from Paraguari. She left Asuncion on Saturday at 9 a.m., making the run in 73 hours. This is one of the most splendid runs on record, and is highly creditable to our friend Captain Morse, who is now in command of her.

The Tychio Brabe is expected in Montevideo to-day or to-morrow, Mr. and Mrs. Anderson, are expected by her after a six months absence in Europe.

The Editor of the 'Nacion' kindly favored us on Monday with the proof of Lopez's letter of instruction to the Commanders of Humaitá, Allen, Martinez, and Cabral, dated San Fernando, 16th April 1863, when he thought it possible that a British gunboat, might attempt to force the passage of Humaitá, in consequence of the claims brought forward by Mr. Gould, for the liberation of the English subjects at Lopez's service.

The death is announced in Asuncion of General Andrade Neves, Baron do Triunfo, from an illness of which he had been suffering for some time past.

The Provocador brought down from Rosario mails and passengers from the Pacific coast and the Cuyo Provinces. We have much pleasure in welcoming back D. Augusto Carie on his return from San Juan.

Two days after our arrival we were glad to secure our seats in the diligence for Mendoza, after such 'hair-breadth escapes,' and living almost exclusively on beef for 15 days; for you must know that in San Luis there are no vegetables produced, purely from laziness and indolence on the part of the puntanos.
