All sums of money which may be awarded by the commissioners or by the arbitrator or umpire, on account of any claim, shall be paid in coin, or its equivalent by the one government to the other, as the case may be, within eighteen months after the date of the decision, without interest.

The high contracting parties engage to consider the result of the proceedings at his commission as a full, perfect, and final settlement of every claim upon either government arising out of any transaction of a date prior to the ratification of the present convention, and further engage that every such claim whether or not the same may have been presented to the notice of the said Commission, shall, from and after the conclusion of the proceedings of the said Commission, be considered and treated as finally settled, barred, and thenceforth inadmissible.

The Commissioners, and the arbitrator or umpire, shall keep an accurate record, and correct minutes or notes of all their proceedings, with the dates thereof, and shall appoint and employ a clerk, or other persons, to assist them in the transaction of the business which may come before them.

The present Convention shall be ratified by the President of the United States, and with the advice and consent of the Senate thereof, and by her Britannic Majesty, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as may be, within twelve months from the date hereof.

In witness whereof the respective plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms.

Rounding the first bend, we passed close to the 'Belisario,' with the monster 'Crioillo' lying on her deck, and as we skimmed by the 'J. T. Brady' and other vessels, their crews sent forth hearty cheers; in fact, if our frail craft were about to breast the Atlantic billows and cross the world, we could not have received more sincere though boisterous expressions of interest in our future happiness, welfare, and all the etc. usual on such trying occasions.

The 'Oran' now began, perhaps from exuberance of spirits, to show a little temper, and, like many of her sex, would not steer; some tall and graceful willow's tears would first attract her sympathy, and no amount of persuasion would induce her to pass it without a loving embrace, and then she would gracefully sweep through the fruit trees overhanging the banks with the same movement and effect as we have often seen some fair daisies sweep through a drawing-room, the by-man-detested crinoline demolishing everything within its reach.

Notwithstanding these contretemps, which only added enjoyment to the scene, we soon arrived at 'La Isla de Croza,' where, after partaking of some very fine fruit, the production of the island, the business of the day commenced.

Here, amidst those sylvan solitudes, the Druid auctioneer raised his voice in eloquent description of the beauties and advantages of his wares, consisting of large tracts of this island Paradise that has lately been so fully and eloquently described that we must be excused from recapitulating its marvels.

La Isla de Croza, with its 60,000 trees, house, boats, and everything then on it, including all right and title to the "houris" supposed to be concealed in its sylvan recesses, was knocked down to Mr. Alexander at what may be called, in trade language, the "ridiculously low figure" of \$50,000 mpc.

Be it understood that it is the squatter's right, and not the fee-simple of the land that was sold.

After a short delay we again started—but our coquetish little craft was still inclined for a passing flirtation with the willows, and at last was brought to a halt.

Mr. Billinghamst and a select few proceeding in a boat a little further up, in order to dispose of the second Elysian field on the list, while the Oran was induced to return, stern foremost, to the Isla de Croza, where a substantial lunch of "carne con cuero" was ready smoking on the table.

It is difficult, within parliamentary bounds, to find a simile strong enough to express the vigour with which we attacked the viands, and, after a cigar and half-hour's lounge, we were soon again on board the Oran, whose nose had been, through superhuman exertions, got round. Away we went at a rattling pace, having a new hand at the helm, whose grasp of the tiller showed that he was no novice at the work.

Soon the island of Esperita was reached, and, after another eloquent appeal to the feelings and pockets of his audience, Mr Billinghamst knocked down the island, in three separate lots, to Mr Crabtree, Manager of the Northern Railway, at the following figures:

A lovely moonlight night closed a lovely day, and as we sauntered homeward through the cool air, we felt that we had seldom passed a pleasanter day than that on which the great island nation came off.

SPECIAL TELEGRAM. LATEST RIVER PLATE INTELLIGENCE.

The following important telegram was transmitted to Europe per the Arno: Buenos Ayres, Sunday Night, Feb. 28, 1869.

Very little business done since the sailing of the Arno. Some few sales of dry cowhides for American account, and all the Paraguayan hides which have come down from Asuncion, and which have been embargoed by order of Government, have been sold by public auction for Government account—fetching higher prices than has been known for years in this market, some lots selling for 47 1/2 rls. There are over two hundred claimants for these hides.

In the wool market much inactivity—buyers waiting their letters per French mail. Very few lots good quality now coming into market; nearly all fine lots have been sold. On the day the packet left Mr. Duggan sold the best lot in market, 11,000 arr. very superior wool at reserved prices; bought for French account.

Latest dates from Paraguay announce the arrival of Sr. Paranhos; but no military movement has taken place, Lopez marched to Paraguari, a central town, and has nearly all the country about there secured by raiding parties. Some few families, in the most miserable state, have escaped from the mountains. The nominal seat of Government is still at Pirabebe, in the mountains, where Sanchez, the Vice-President of Paraguay, still maintains all the outward forms of Government. The American Minister, General McMahon, and the foreign Consuls are all there. There is no scarcity of food; but Lopez has neither arms nor ammunition. From the interior of the country Lopez, it is said, has gathered some few recruits. Trado in Asuncion is most paralysed, and, according to latest dates, even the hotels were empty. The health of Asuncion is good; no cholera.

In Corrientes there has been much sickness, but, owing to the adoption of stringent sanitary measures, the health of that city is now much improved.

The Argentine Government has cancelled the grant of the Santa Fé Government of 100 square leagues on the rivers Rey and Parana, in the Chaco, to Don Adolfo Mansilla, on the ground that the territory does not belong to the Province of Santa Fé, but to the National Government, and it is said that President Sarmiento proposes, on the meeting of Congress, to create two new Provinces or States in that part of the Gran Chaco, which skirts the banks of the Parana and Paraguay to a point in front of Asuncion, the capital of Paraguay. This mooted measure meets with great favor; as the lands in question are the richest and most fertile in South America.

The National Government has also extended the period for awarding the prize for the best means of preserving beef to the 31st August; but all applications must be accompanied by samples. Already the samples are numerous.

Great excitement about the election for Governor. Several candidates, all of the Liberal party, in the field. Club meetings and proclamations. Sr. Castro the Governor pro tem.—considered the most likely candidate for the post, but is opposed by the "Tribuna," the organ of the Liberal party, and is supported by the "Nacion Argentina," the organ of the anti- Liberal Party. The elections are appointed to take place in March.

Money market of Buenos Ayres continues to be affected by the financial crisis in Montevideo. Gold shipped by every steamer to Montevideo for saladero and shipping houses; crisis in Montevideo intensifying each day; Oriental Minister has proposed measures of relief—to increase taxes, place a duty on coal, and emit new bonds to fund debt due by Government and Town Corporation. This scheme meets with little favor here or in Montevideo. Liquidation of banks continues. The Maua Bank of Buenos Ayres continues doing an excellent business, notwithstanding the state of the Montevideo market. Since the packet left, nearly £40,000 in gold was shipped to Montevideo. This has caused a better demand for money here, and last night bills were discounted on the Bolsa at 10 and 12 per cent. per annum. National Bonds have fallen considerably, closing last night weak at 53 1/2. The Provincial Bank continues to hold immense specie reserves, and discounts freely at 7 per cent. per annum. Gas shares are in demand, and buyers are offering 60 per cent. premium, ex div., but no sellers. Argentine Bank meeting postponed for want of a quorum.

British barque 'Royal Dane' wrecked on English bank; nothing saved.

The river steamer 'Rio Negro,' after repeated efforts by divers and others, proves a total wreck in the harbour of Montevideo.

Hon. Wm. Sturt, British Minister, and Hon. Mr. Worthington, American Minister, still at Rosario, having gone on an excursion on the Central Argentine Railway.

Dr. Rufino Elizalde, former Argentine Minister of Foreign Affairs, left this morning for Paraguay; he leaves on private business of his own, supposed to be connected with the lawsuits respecting the embargoed hides, also the starting of a steam saw mill in the Gran Chaco.

The Argentine Government has named to special commissioner to meet Sr. Paranhos in Asuncion, and it is said that President Sarmiento is opposed to the scheme of forming a Provisional Paraguayan Government.

A meeting of the shareholders of the Paraná Bank has been held, and by a unanimous vote that bank and the Entre-Rio Bank are amalgamated.

The French Theatre was crowded on Saturday night to witness the first performance of 'La Belle Helene.' We noticed H.E. the President there.

The most rising place about Buenos Ayres is the Boca; within the last two years the value of property has doubled in that quarter.

Business in Rosario improving; the Municipality has decreed the formation of a public library.

British steamer Flansted left last night with passengers and cargo. British steamer Humboldt leaves tomorrow.

Large arrivals of wheat expected from Chile, several vessels having left this port in ballast to load in Valparaiso.

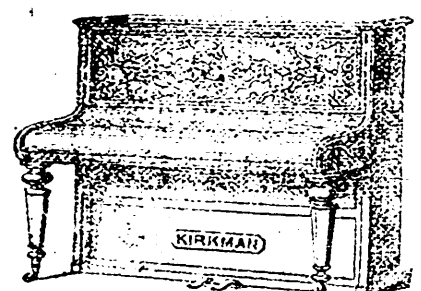

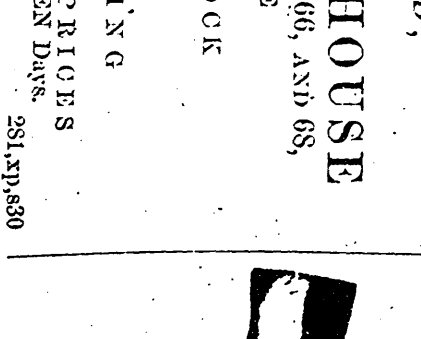
