OPINIONS OF THE AMERICAN PRESS ON THE ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.

President Sarmiento. Private advices from the Argentine Republic give cheering hopes for the future of that much vexed country.

Our winter, so far, has been extremely mild and unseasonable, with a succession for many weeks past, of heavy gales and much rain.

The following despatch was received on Tuesday at the Government House from the commander of the southern frontier, Col. Julio Campos:—

Camp on the shores of the 'Quequin Salado,' Feb. 25, 1869, 4 p.m. To General E. Conesa, Inspector General of Arms.

I have the honor to inform you that at 5 p.m. on the 22nd, while encamped with my division two leagues below this point, I received the enclosed despatch.

At once set out, and after sixteen hours of forced marching, overtook the invading Indians at 9 a.m. on the 23d, eight leagues on the other side of the 'Laguna Sayago.'

On our side, we had the sergeant Nicaron Guenero killed, and a soldier of Fortin Machado missing, although the two prisoners state that he is not dead.

I am bound to recommend to the Government the splendid behaviour of the officers and men of this division as well as of the Mobilized National Guard.

PROVINCIAL STATISTICS. SALTA IN 1866. The measures taken by the National Government to carry into effect the law relative to a general census of the Republic, render interesting the publication of some statistical data of the Provinces.

The great preponderance of Bolivians is explained by the proximity of Bolivia, and its frequent civil wars. Of the 101,143, 81,057 could neither read nor write.

There were in the same year 19 schools and colleges for boys, with 1,015 pupils; 20 for girls, with 873 pupils, or 1,918 pupils, equal to one for every 54.3 souls.

The list of trades in Salta was as follows:— Five printing offices, 2 photographic establishments, 2 apothecaries shops (in the city), 2 watchmakers, 2 casinos, 5 cafes and fondas, 70 shops (tiendas), 19 hardware and provision stores, (almacenes), 2 auctioneers, 15 silversmiths, 43 blacksmiths, 8 butchers, 2 barbers, 96 bakers (almost all women), 1 confectioner, 19 carpenters, 88 tailors, 164 bootmakers, 52 hatmakers [for sheep and vicuña wool], 2 soap manufacturers, 73 candlemakers [same as bakers], 2 tinner, 31 saddlers, 15 cigar shops, 67 flour mills [on a primitive system], 5 sugar manufactories, 5 spirit stills, 9 limekilns, 46 tanneries, 2 sawmills, 11 billiards, 2 corkpits, and 250 pulperias.

OF THE 101,143 inhabitants, 13,649 were white, and 83,484 coloured, and formed 17,645 families. They lived in 36,090 houses, of which 90 had more than one floor, 354 were of azote.

From Montevideo telegrams were received to day, announcing the sale of 3,000 hides at 60; only 3,000 hides stock. 7,000 ar. wool at 24 1/2 paper; 80 gds per cent. The quantities still continue.

THE VERY flat state of the Bond market is chiefly attributed to a growing apprehension that money will next month be very tight, exchange low, and possibly gold exported. The instant money commands an interest of one per cent per month, Bonds, it is said, must go below fifty; but this is by no means certain.

There is a great complaint about the Montevideo Government continuing quarantine. The inconvenience caused by this in the river ports is such that it is a serious drawback to trade, and the saladero business is represented as very much behind hand; in Montevideo also the saladero business has been very slack, and in Buenos Ayres it would be brisker but that cattle keep coming in so slowly.
