We managed "Gouge-eyes" in 15 minutes, and pronounced it very pretty shooting—when it was ended.

He never works except when half seas over, and I should fear to trust him when dead sober; he is slow to excess, taking five minutes to don his coat, and to slip his feet into his ragged slippers. Yet he is the only real pilot that I saw upon the river, he knows it thoroughly, he will be master on board, and he slings a recumbent paddle with the action of an Oxford coxswain—in my day.

Certainly no beauty was M. C., but he was stout-hearted and true. We soon learned to confide in his nerve, force, and precision. There was something more interesting even than beauty in his danger-look, when, working his paddle like the tailfin of a monstrous fish and firmly planted in the stern canoe of the rocking and tossing raft, he bent slightly forward, steadily eyeing with straining glance the grim wall upon which we were dashing, at the rate of 20 knots an hour, and by a few ingenious strokes of the helm at the exact moment, brought round the bows and almost grazed the reef.

I ordered my largest boat to be manned by four sailors, and lowered, and another laden with all apparatus necessary for such an occasion. Notwithstanding the bad weather, and high sea, they reached the ship and saved the three men composing the crew. The vessel proved to be the English barque Lear, captain George Jack, who embarked at 4 o'clock in the morning, together with the pilot and his wife, servant, and the rest, in all nine persons.

The Lear is the property of Mr. Bieglow, of New Scotia, and had left Buenos Ayres on the 3rd inst. with a cargo of bones for Philadelphia. On the morning of the 7th I was enabled to save a few sails and other things of little value, of which I shall give an account to the Consul at Montevideo.

THE HARVEST. The following extract from a communication addressed by the Chilean Consul here to his Minister, may not prove uninteresting, as showing that gentlemen's views on the late harvest.

Allow me to inform Y. E. that from what I can gather, from corn growers and millers in this republic, the wheat harvest is almost all lost, and consequently large speculations are being entered into in corn and flour.

This should have an effect on the Chilean markets, and induce exportation on a scale commensurate with the wants of the River Plate and Brazil.

In my communications of the 11th and 24th January, 1869, I sent you similar news respecting the bad harvest of last year.

The exportation from Chile confirmed the supposition that grain would be wanting here, and I think that it will again be wanting this year.

Letters from Buenos Ayres and Montevideo contradict the above assertion of the Chilean Consul, that in the Argentine Republic the greater part of the harvest had been lost. Native flour had fallen \$15 per arr. and wheat \$40; Chilian flour had also fallen considerably. It is believed that it will fall still lower, for since the end of December no less than 25 cargoes have left for the Plate and Brazil.

On 19th inst. further sales of mestizo will be held, including 1000 bales "Jackson" locks, chiefly washed.

The following vessels have arrived at Liverpool:—Don Diego, sailed from Montevideo on the 22nd December, arrived 29th January—55 days. Parejero, sailed from Montevideo on the 9th December, arrived 31st Jan.—53 days. Ceara, sailed from Buenos Ayres on the 12th December, arrived 6th February—56 days.

Note.—The Parejero arrived at Holyhead on the 30th, and would have been docked same day, but owing to stress of weather she was detained there 24 hours.
