The plan of Mr. Coghlan, so far as I am aware, took no cognizance of the solid residues, and consisted in the collection of the liquid residues from all the saladeros into one deposit, from whence, by force pumps and metal pipes, they were to be carried out into the river in the neighborhood of Quilmes.

Any modification of this plan, by using the residues for the purpose of irrigation would have failed, in consequence of the excessive quantity of salt they would have contained.

The proposal of Sr. Puiggari (and I presume also of Sr. Catalini) aims at the establishment of a new industry by the utilisation of all the residues of the saladeros, and conceived on such a magnificent scale, that it will require the formation of a company with a capital of from six to eight millions of dollars currency, and is to open up a new source of riches to the country.

In the present working of the saladeros, there is a loss of every hundred animals killed about 27 pipes of liquid effluents—that is to say, about 10 pipes agua de cola, 10 " salmuera, 7 " blood and waters from the playa and grease press.

On rainy days the quantity would be very greatly increased. The most valuable of these products is the salmuera, which has often been made the subject of experiment, and it is said to have been proved that it can be profitably recovered, in the ordinary, large, open, evaporating pans, when its market value rises to 14 lbs. per faena.

Again, to introduce any of this salt as a constituent of manure, would be to deteriorate it with an article which, in Europe, would not have the value of the freight from the saladeros to the outer roads.

The only article of value in the liquid residues for an exportable manure is the blood, which amounts to three or four pipes to the hundred animals. When this can be obtained clean, it can be turned to many profitable purposes, and in an experimental killing of a few hundred animals, it may be so obtained; but, in the height of the season, when there are large and consecutive killings, and especially for a company in whose profits the saladeristas themselves had no interest, it would be found impossible to obtain it without being mixed to such an extent with the 'bosta' from the playa as to render it, in most cases, unfit for shipment.

Of the agua de cola and the waters from the press and the playa, the dilution is so great that at no time could more than five per cent. of dry matter suitable for manure be obtainable—often times much less—and even of this infinitesimal portion, the ammonia, which is the only valuable ingredient it contains, would be destroyed by the strong heat of a reverberating furnace, so as to render it equivalent to the entire destruction of the liquid residues, instead of their conversion into profitable manure.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE U. STATES AND GREAT BRITAIN, Respecting the Naturalization of Immigrants.

Minister Plenipotentiary from the United States of America, and Edward Henry, Lord Stanley, of Bickerstaff, Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, being respectively authorized and empowered to place on record the desire of the President of the United States of America and Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, to regulate the citizenship of citizens of the United States of America who have emigrated or may emigrate from the United States of America to British dominions, and of British subjects who have emigrated or who may emigrate from the British dominions to the United States of America, have agreed upon the following protocol:

FIRST. Such citizens as aforesaid of the United States, who have become, or shall become, and are naturalized, according to law within the British dominions as British subjects, shall, subject to the provisions of Articles 2 and 4, be held by the United States to be, in all respects, and for all purposes, British subjects, and shall be treated as such by the U. States.

Second. Such British subjects as aforesaid who have become or shall become, and are naturalized according to law within the United States of America as subjects thereof, shall, subject to the provisions of Articles 2 and 4, be held by Great Britain to be, in all respects, and for all purposes, American citizens, and shall be treated as such by G. Britain.

Such United States citizens as aforesaid who have become and are naturalized within the British dominions as British subjects, and such British subjects as aforesaid who have become and are naturalized as citizens within the United States, shall be at liberty to renounce their naturalization, and to resume their respective nationalities, provided that such renunciation be publicly declared within two years after this protocol shall have been carried into effect, as provided by Article 4.

The manner in which this renunciation may be made, and publicly declared, shall be hereafter agreed upon by the respective Governments.

If such American citizens as aforesaid, naturalized within the British dominions, should renew their residence in the United States of America, or on his own application and on such conditions as that Government may think fit to impose, readmit him to the character and privileges of an American citizen, and Great Britain shall not in that case claim him as a British subject on account of his former naturalization. In the same manner if such British subjects as aforesaid, naturalized in the United States, should renew his residence within the British dominions, the British Government may, on his own application and on such condition as that Government may think fit to impose, readmit him to the character and privileges of a British subject, and the United States shall not in that case claim him as a citizen of the United States on account of his former naturalization.

As it will not be practicable for Great Britain to carry into operation the principles laid down in this protocol until provision has been made by the Imperial Parliament for such a revision of the existing laws as the adoption of those principles involves, it is agreed that this protocol shall not take effect until such legislation can be accomplished.

The British Government will introduce measures into Parliament for this purpose as speedily as may be possible, having regard to the variety of public and private interests which may be affected by a change in the laws of naturalization and allegiance now under consideration by the Royal Commission, whose report is expected shortly to be made.

The same provision not being necessary by the Constitution and laws of the U. States, this article is not made reciprocal.
