LATEST RIVER PLATE NEWS. The following important telegram was despatched by the River Plate

Telegraph to Europe by the Arno:-

Since the sailing of the packet two teamers have arrived from Paraguay. bringing rather unfavourable news for the allies. The Paraguavans again came down by rail to the bridge of Yugery, and again surprised the Brazilians, carrying off as prisoners of war a small picquet of Brazilians in the railway waggons. Immediately afterwards, the Brazilian commander marched out his men and followed the manager of the Argentine Bank, and waggons along the line, determined, if in former years was known to all as possible, to recapture them, but up to latest dates nothing had been known of the expedition, and it was generally rumoured in Asuncion on the leaving of the steamer that another sanguinary fight near Cerro Leon had

taken place. A Paraguayan deserter having given information that Lopez, with about 300 men, were close to the town of Luque, a strong force was instantly despatched to take the position.

Some small bodies of Paraguayan cavalry have advanced as far as Luque and taken several prisoners. They still hang about the woods, to the great annoyance of the Brazilian garrison stationed in that town, about 6000 strong.
