The Commission, therefore, with authority from the Government, will provide water mains for the

entire city on the following conditions:
I. The inhabitants of any squire can have the pipes laid in it, including the service pipes as far as the doors of the houses, by paying on account of the future supply \$18,000 (eighteen thousand dollars currency) which would be equivalent to \$65 (sixty-five dollars currency) per vara of frontage.
2. In exchange for this advance, the Commis-

sion will hand over vales which will serve for the payment for the water to be supplied, and which may he used in any part of the city.

3. At the Boca calle and centre of each square will be placed a hydrant, or fire-cock, f. om which water can be token for watering the streets, or in case of fire, when, as before stated, it can b thrown, without my necessity for fire-engines, fifteen varia over the roof of the highest house.

PUBLIC STAND PIPES. At the public stand pipes in the plazas and at other convenient points—in all thirty—the public can take water gratis, for private or public use, but not for sale.

Those who take water for sale, water-carrier or others, will pay at the established rate.

The Commission thinks it unnecessary to dwell on the advantage of an unlimited house supply of water, and will give any information required the office.
