Hugh Gough came of respectable Irish extraction; his father, Mr. George Gough, Lieutenant-Colonel of the Limerick City Militia, having been a gentleman of good family and pro-Limerick. Colonel Gough was fourth, Gough, an English clergyman, who went from Wiltsbire to Ireland early in the reign of James I., and was consecrated Bishop of Limerick in 1626. Of the future Field-Marshal's brothers, one was in the army, and ham it was 21, and in Glasgow 40. another was Major in the City of Limerick Militia, while the third lived to become Dean of Derry. Hugh Gough himself was born at Wordstown on the 3d of November, 1779. his mother being an Irish lady of good birth and connexions, a daughter of the late Mr. Thomas Bunbury, of Lisnevagh and Moyle, in the county or


