ARRIVAL OF H.I.H. THE COUNT D'EU.

OVATION ON THE MOLE HEAD.

The Count d'Eu can claim the honor of being the first Prince that ever visited the Plate. Nowadays, when princes wander about the globe for pleasure or business, or both, a visit from a scion of the House of Brunswick or Orleans attracts but local atomnibuses and steamers the European public is so accustomed to meet with Royalty has ceased to attract crowds, lishmen and natives. but here in Buenes Agres, democrats that we are, a Prince of the Blood is a sort of "rara avis;" and it is not to be wondered at, as it was generally known through town on Tuesday that the grandson of Louis Phillippe, and a Prince of the House of Braganza, also very plain. would land at the Mole Head yesterday morning, that a crowd of anxious spectators should be gathered.

She ran up first towards the Pozos, and finally anchored within a few squares of the Pier.

REPORT OF THE EXPEDITION TO MATTO GROSSO.

On January 15, I started from Assurcion in the gunboat Henrique Martins, to take command of the expedition departing in the evening for Fecho dos Morros.

The gunboat Araguary, towing the Brazilian schooner José I, loaded with goods and provisions for the ampliers of the Brazilian army, took the lead, and in her wake came the Henrique Martins, because the Araguary had the best of the three pilots that made part of the commission.

Below the stream cailed Confuso was seen a canoe coming down the river and bearing a white flag. The Henrique Martins making the same signal, the boat came up, and from those on board were learned the following facts:

"They were three Paraguayan soldiers that, with seven others, had been in a village of Occidental, whence they
