As the Government wishes to extend over the largest arrathe advantages and economy which a supply of water in the houses will afford, the Commission has been authorised to lay pipes in the streets not as yet provided with them, by means of advances, on account of the rates for supply, to be made by the inhabitants.

The Commission, therefore, with authority from the Government, will provide water mains for the entire city on the following conditions:

I. The inhabitants of any square can have the pipes laid in it, including the service pipes as far as the doors of the houses, by paying on account of the future supply \$18,000 (eighteen thousand dollars currency), which would be equivalent to \$65 (sixty-five dollars currency) per wara of frontage.

THE FLOODS IN SANTA FE.

The mails received from up the rivers yesterday afford further particulars of the damage sustained by the present floods. THE BURNOS AYRES IRONWORK. We extract the following from our contemporary the "Ironmonger:"-A large order for the Government of Buenos Ayres has just been completed by Messrs. Barnard, Bishop, & Barnards. The order is said to have been submitted to three large houses for competie tion; but the great firm of Barnard, Bishop & Barnards seems to have a speciality for manufacturing gates, as the park gates at Sandringham, and the terrace gates at the French Exhibition amply testify. The monster gates for Buenos Ayres are over thirty eight feet wide, and ten feet high, and braced so singularly together that, like a good many 'Homes' we know of, they are 'self supporting,' each leaf weighing a ton and a-half, and yet, pushing one with your hand, it moved like a feather. As for strength, these leaves of railway history look strong enough to keep even an engine on the 'rampago,' with steam up and driver killed, a prisoner. They are to go over three lines of rail. 
