





the members composing it; they may for all I know be models of virtue. By the acts and decisions of this court I judge it, and I say that they have engendered swindling, fraud, and robbery.

Through the effect of these decisions hundreds of families have been reduced to beggary, while some dozen of adventurers have made fortunes.

The judgments pronounced have been founded on verbal statements, or written evidence tendered by certain parties, always the same—who turn and veer about as they would in a set of quadrilles.

It is known that Lopez has sequestered goods, and sold them by public auction, said goods legally passing to third parties, for his government was the only one in the country and recognized as such by the allies, and other foreign governments.

Why should thousands of hides be handed over to John or James, because said John or James be a President, or because he had dealings with such a one, if there are no documents to prove that said party is his debtor, and this individual may be still alive confined in one of Lopez's prisons, or if not, he has left perhaps a widow, children or brothers.

By what form of justice, or rule of law, does John or James become owner of such wares, in such a store of warehouse, without their quality or quantity having been first determined and some reason given for the goods which they claim bearing brands which bear not the slightest resemblance to theirs.

In such a delicate matter the allied Government should have proceeded with more circumspection. All agree that they might have appropriated everything in the place had Asuncion been declared a military post.

Everyone recognizes this right; but if they have been so chivalrously generous as not to wish to injure neutrals or the families of those sacrificed by Lopez, why do they now allow a few speculators to reduce to misery those who they wished to protect.

An immense responsibility rests with the Allies, and especially with Brazil, for allowing these things to occur.

In Asuncion and Luque were stored the greater portion of the hides, tobacco, and yerba, which the Allies recognized as being the property of neutrals, and now, if these goods have passed to other hands than those of the legitimate owners, the Brazilian Government must be held responsible for it.

proved, ready for every sacrifice, can not from his state of health do anything. The Comte D'Eu is said to be coming. Let him come firmly resolved to root out abuses, to do his duty as a soldier, provided with full powers, but divested of those pretensions only pleasing to abject and servile courtiers.

The arrival of the Comte D'Eu is of more importance than it seems. On him depends not only the solution of our difficulties, but the fate of the Brazilian monarchy. If the shade of royalty continues to shelter robbery and favoritism, every soldier that returns to Brazil will be an apostle of republicanism, already fermenting in many minds.

There is no further news of the Rosario expedition. I will send copies of the celebrated judgments by next Sunday's steamer and informal (if I may use the expression) can these goods be handed over to persons who possess no authentic documents whatever, and can only show in proof of their claims declarations made by people in the same position as themselves, viz. adventurers who in their turn assume as witnesses in favor of their own claims those whom they have helped to possession of twenty, thirty or fifty thousand duros.

How is it that no native has as yet undertaken the task of translating it into Spanish? No doubt, that by doing so he would render to this country a service which is of more importance indeed than all these never-ceasing political squabbles here are.

I received the first volume of the Handbook, for which I return you a thousand thanks. I expected a great improvement on your first Handbook, and a meritorious work in every sense, but this has really far surpassed even my expectations.

Such a work, profusely and properly distributed in Europe, would be the means of preventing such people as British Members of Parliament and the editors of the London "Saturday Review" from committing gross blunders when they speak of these countries.

Immigration agents may be very good in their way, but the Handbook, in my opinion, would leave them far in the background. Unprejudiced parties will admit that your adopted country owes you a debt that it will find difficult to cancel.
