While the poor animals were having probably their first good mouthful for many a day, down thundered a squadron of Paraguayan lancers, sweeping off all the horses, together with the mounted picquet that was watching them. A dismounted dragoon is about as managable as a fish out of water; so the astute Brazilian specimens of the tribe were obliged to "look pleasant" while the Paraguayans, with mocking shouts, cantered off with their chargers. Considering the reported death of horses in the Brazilian army, the loss of the horses of an entire regiment is a serious one.

We have been informed from a reliable source that the news contained in a letter published in the "Standard" two days ago, relative to an attempted rising among the Paraguayans in Asuncion, is devoid of any truth. We can only add that the letter in question was written to us by a person of high respectability that has for some time past been resident in Asuncion. It would appear, however, that he has been the victim of some plausible "canard."

To-morrow night H. E. President Sarmiento gives a grand banquet to Minister Paranhos and the foreign diplomatic corps. Some of the Ministers will also be present.

We are happy to announce that Admiral Davis, no mean authority upon the subject, has stated that the proposed plan for the construction of the Port of Buenos Ayres, on which is based the contract lately signed between the Minister of the Interior and Don Eduardo Madero, meets with his most unqualified approval, and we are further informed that the Admiral is preparing a full report on the matter for his Government, which will no doubt be of the highest importance.

Our sporting readers will find in another column the entries for the Belgrano Races, that come off this day fortnight. The fields are all good, with the exception of the first race, and all the races promise to be well contested. The concurrence of people promises to be so enormous that the committee find themselves in the greatest difficulties to provide sufficient accommodation. We understand that in view of this, and to make the attendance more select, they intend raising the price of admittance to the grand stand. Members of the Jockey Club will of course be admitted free of any charge.

In the train which left the Retiro Station for the Tigre at 2:20 p.m. on Wednesday last, there were four deserters from an Argentine man-of-war, who had been arrested in the city, and were being brought back to their ship. As the train was going at full speed between San Isidro and San Fernando, two of them jumped out, and were killed instantaneously.

The engine that brought the last train to town from the Tigre on Wednesday ran off the line near San Fernando; happily no one was killed, but the train did not reach town till ten o'clock.

H.I.H. the Comte D'Eu, on his way to Asuncion, landed for a few hours at Corrientes, with the object of paying the Governor a visit. After a stroll through the town, H.I.H. returned on board the Alice and resumed his journey.

KLONEMENT IN HIGH LIFE. This event, which has been a subject of conversation, was mentioned in obscure terms in a London evening newspaper, but the absence of Captain Vivian during the discussion on the army estimates, on an occasion when of all others he might have been expected in his place in Parliament, lent confirmation to the rumor that he was the victim in the unhappy affair.

Captain Vivian was born in 1818, and is therefore in his fifty-first year, but to judge from his appearance no one would suppose him to be more than forty at the outside. He is a handsome and very gentlemanly man.

IMPORTANT CASE. JUDICIAL COMMITTEE OF THE PRIVY COUNCIL.

Denmark, with an area of eight and a-half million acres has upwards of five and a-half million acres under crops; Bavaria, with an acreage of eighteen and three-quarter millions, cultivates over eleven millions; Prussia, with its eighty-five and a-half million acres, has fifty-nine and a-half millions under crops; Belgium, having an area of less than seven and a-half millions, cultivates over four and a-half millions. Italy, with its vineyards, pastures, and olive gardens, utilises over forty-seven million acres; and France, with its area of 132 1/2 million acres, uses nearly ninety millions in agriculture.

In 1867 there were in New South Wales eleven and a-half million sheep and one and three-quarters million cattle; in New Zealand, 312,829 cattle and eight and a-half million sheep; in Queensland, 940,354 of the former and over eight and a-half millions of the latter; in Cape of Good Hope, 692,514 cattle and nearly ten million sheep; in Victoria, 598,968 of the former and nearly nine millions of the latter; in Prince Edward's Island, about 200,000 live stock; in South Australia, about four and a-half millions; in Western Australia, nearly 600,000; at Mauritius, 54,000; at Natal, over half a million; and in Tasmania there were 1,833,799 live stock in 1868.

IMPORTANT CASE.

JUDICIAL COMMITTEE OF THE PRIVY COUNCIL.

(Before Lord Chelmsford, Sir J. Colville, and Sir J. Napier.) Giblin and others v. M. Mallen.

Important Decision. This case involved an important question as to the liability of bankers for securities deposited with them by their customers.

One Richard Lewis left in the care of the Union Bank of Australia railway debentures to £10,450, which one of the officials of the bank had abstracted, and as the bank were bailees without reward, the point was whether the securities had been lost through their negligence to render them liable. An action was brought in the Supreme Court of Victoria, and the Chief Justice having declined to nonsuit the plaintiff, the case went to the jury, and they found a verdict for £10,450. Leave was reserved to enter a nonsuit, and the rule was made absolute, and from that decision the executors of Lewis appealed to her Majesty.

On the part of the appellants, the Solicitor General contended that the bank was liable, and on the part of the bank Mr. Mellish, Q.C., urged that there had not been negligence to take the case out of the rule laid down in former judgments.
