The late rains have completely destroyed for the present the occupation of tropers and carmen in the camp. Towards the south the camps are impassable, and almost all the wool and other produce coming to town is sent by rail.

The attendance at the Philharmonic concert on Monday was one of the largest ever seen in the Coliseum. H.E. the President of the Republic honored the concert with his presence.

We received yesterday advices from Fray Bentos, which represent business as very dull there, in fact, our correspondent says it could not be worse.

There is, however, plenty of fencing going on just outside the town, the land round the saladero being completely enclosed. There has been severe loss experienced in cattle in that neighborhood, the disease resembling rinderpest.

We hear that on one estancia 69 head of fine cattle died in one night of this new epidemic. Everything connected with Paraguay has more or less a right to be considered a curiosity, so we have concluded same to two railway tickets, specimens of those struck off at the Parque Station here, for the line between Asuncion and Luque, and have accordingly placed them in our cosmopolitan museum.

We also received from Captain Davis, of the Luján, a specimen of tobacco from a well known store in Rosario, which not only smokes well, but is adaptable for feeding mice, at least so the mice think, for they have finished a goodly quantity of the weed. We presume the curiosity connected with this interesting announcement is to be found in the additional proof it affords of the oft asserted similarity in the proceedings of 'mice and men,' the first named animal having now apparently taken to 'chewing tobacco.'

There is a noted increase in the number of French immigrants to our shores during the first three months of the present, as compared with the past year. Last year they numbered from Bordeaux above 604; this year from that port 979 immigrants reached the Plate. From Genoa the numbers were 3,384 during the same period. We yesterday assigned a very satisfactory reason, at least in our humble opinion, for this increase in immigration, and we feel assured that the returns for April, May, and June will show a still further advance, arising from the same cause.

We have purposely avoided making any allusion to the disagreeable incident promoted by the commission of the Alcazar, with reference to the d'Hoté benefit. The question has, however, assumed such proportions, and given rise to so many erroneous comments, that we are compelled to break through our reserve, least, by a studied silence, we should appear to shrink from our share of solidarity with the rest of our colleagues on this question.

Mr. Wals, the talented editor of the "Courrier," has placed the matter in its proper light in the letter he has addressed to the President of the Alcazar Commission, which appeared in the columns of the paper under his management the day before yesterday, and his very pertinent remarks meet with our most unconditional approval. The motives that may have actuated the Commission of the Alcazar in their extraordinary behaviour, we are unwilling to meddle, but it certainly seems passing strange that a few gentlemen who are at the head of an establishment such as the Alcazar, should set themselves to read a lecture on public morality, not only to a commission of gentlemen brought together for a purpose of philanthropy, but to the whole public of Buenos Ayres.

As to the absurd pretensions of the Alcazar Committee to gag the press and think that by withdrawing the entries, which by courtesy all public entertainments honor themselves in giving to the local papers, they will do themselves any good, we can only assure them that they are woefully mistaken.

A TRIP TO BAHIA BLANCA. We arrived at Patagones after a splendid trip on Wednesday, the 21st ult., and as we had to stop there to discharge cargo, and load again with goods, which have been lying at the galpon for the last seven months, for different persons in Bahia, I took the opportunity of riding to Mr. Fraser's estancia fifteen leagues up the Rio Negro.

The scenery sometimes was splendid, as the Rio Negro is one of the finest in the Argentine Republic, and there are plenty of trees and hills to relieve the monotony. The camps seemed tolerably good, not very clean, but still there is plenty of room for agricultural purposes, and plenty of grazing for sheep and cattle, which can be kept there without fear of Indians, as the camps are not very open.

At Mr. Fraser's estancia the locusts were very bad last year, but a little higher up the river there were hardly any. However you can never depend on these camps being free entirely from the scourge. Messrs. Aguirre and Murga, the owners of the Patagones, the steamer in which I came down, are small kings in Patagonia, and have done great harm to these camps by putting high prices on the land, and thus putting it out of the power of small capitalists to buy their camp, but it is not necessary to have anything to say to these people, as there is now a new Justice of the Peace, Ignatius Leon, a very decent man, who speaks English, and will do anything in his power for intending settlers.

The port at Patagones is a first rate one, as we were able to go right up to the mole and discharge cargo; the only hindrance is the bar, at which you are sometimes obliged to stop three or four days waiting for the winds and waves to go down in order to get out of the river.

The town of Patagones is very badly laid out, as it is all up the side of a hill, and walking is almost impossible on account of the sand, but a tolerable brisk trade goes on, and the town is somewhat more lively than Bahia Blanca.

We arrived in Bahia Blanca one day after leaving Patagonia. No ships are able to come anywhere near the mole, so launches are obliged to be used to transport passengers and goods from the ship to the mole; and when we did land, everything was obliged to be carted from the mole to the town, a distance of two leagues—this is a great hindrance to commerce.

The town when arrived at presents a much nicer appearance than Patagones, being laid out on a better plan. The camp on the Sauce Grande is not quite safe from Indians, and cattle cannot yet be kept there, but the camps I believe are better than those in Patagonia, being cleaner, and as yet free from locusts.

tevidio, and a rumpus down there is now confidently expected. The presence of the American Minister and the British Consul on 'Change gave colour to rumours of diplomatic complications which we are quite willing to contradict 'in toto.'

Each acre rules at 49, but is not so very firm, at that rate some bills with credits having been passed at 48. Some of the more experienced exchange brokers are of the opinion, that exchange will not fall much under its present rate, even, supposing that the provincial loan for railways will not be drawn for some months yet.

Owing to the unwillingness of commercial houses to take exchange at a rate more than 49, the army bills on Rio have also to be taken into account, about £20,000 of these bills have been already passed for this packet, and the total amount passed up to the present is estimated at £100,000.

In the wool markets there were some sales to-day; about 6,000 arrobes bought for shipment to Antwerp at 39 good wool, but with carottilla. The arrivals from the South continue, but the bulk of the wool coming in is at once sent to d'posit. Lamb's wool has fallen off in price within the last few days, as also dryskins, and the fall in the price of shooks indicates increased dullness in the Llow trade.

The saladeristas in Barracas are killing much slower than last week. One saladero has done nothing for three days. Cattle are coming in very poor, and the price in the corrales is considered high for animals in their present condition. As yet, there has been nothing done in canon-killing, and many of the saladeristas expect a milder winter in the sheep grasslands, owing to the poor condition of the flocks outside. There is and cold weather has had a very marked effect on the condition of the stock.

251 animals from the estancia of Sr. Martinez de Hoz & Sons were sold today free of charges for ponies and patents—viz., novillos at 180, and cows at 115. The Lujan from Rosario arrived to-day with 50 passengers, and a small consignment of silver and gold. Capt. Davis reports a trade dull in Rosario, but the steamboat passenger business brisker than ever.

Heavy gale on Sunday from the north; one lighter sunk, and some damage done to the shipping. The following is a list of foreign vessels at present in Rosario: Barques—Flying Cloud, Camelot, Mabel, Star of Peace, Havannah, Bertha, and Sharnston. Brigs—Dashing Spray, Wm. Wilson, Solway, Duke of Beaufort, Gen. Havoclock.

The British brig Solway just arrived. Don Luis Dominguez resigned to-day his post in the Public Credit Department. This will be felt a loss, as Sr. Dominguez was an active, good member. The immense transactions between this market and Rio consequent on the Paraguayan war, had increased importance: to-day we received from that market. Yesterday about £70,000 in exchange was drawn at 49 by the great army contractors, Messrs. Lezica & Lanza. But for these bills the rate would most certainly have fallen for the packet; and it was said to-day that these parties have yet more to go for. A correct and exact idea of the state of things in Rio is most desirable. None here seem to comprehend how exchange in Rio holds its present rate. The following important statements respecting Brazilian finances were received yesterday by the mail:

There has long prevailed a conviction that the present high rate of exchange in the face of extraordinary expenditure, must have been maintained by Government aid. In fact the elasticity of our monetary system, is something wonderful; exchange becomes firm, although the financial state of the country is daily becoming more ruinous, and although the Minister of Finance will have to deal with a large deficit, and an inevitable obligation of large expenditure. We know no other means of replenishing the exhausted exchequer but, by an emission of paper.

For exchange a decidedly fat tone prevailed after the departure of the French steamer, and some amounts were passed on France at the equivalent of 18 for bank and 18 1/2 for private bills, the requirements being for River Plate account. During the latter part of the month first class bills were passed at 18 1/2, in anticipation of large remittances from the south to invest in sterling; but this not being the case, and large sales of coffee being made, rates advanced, and banks drew at 18 1/2, while commercial paper was negotiated at 18 3/4, and 1/2, at which rates the market closes firm. The following are the estimated amounts drawn:

On London £230,000. On Paris 2,500,000 frs. at 506 to 522. On Hamburg 120,000 marks Banco at 956 to 960. Government stock 6 per cent, 31 per cent. Gold Bonds 9605. Bank of Brazil shares—178000 to 174000.

Sovereigns—Owing to the importation of thirty thousand from the River Plate, and a slight advance in exchange, a regular panic prevailed the market, and sales were effected at 134100, which is the closing quotation. Freights—Owing to the number of small vessels chartered for Europe, rates have advanced and must be considered firm, but large vessels suitable for the United States are without alteration owing to the number in port. Quotations are as follows:
