tion, said the Government were doing all in their power to repress outrages in Ireland of the character recently reported, but it would be improper for him to state the course which is being pursued with this object.

The Manchester Improvement Bill passed the Committee of the House of Commons yesterday, the petitioners withdrawing their opposition. The bill enables the Corporation to purchase additional lands for waterworks, to widen and alter Deansgate, and to obtain money for these and other purposes.

The Board of Trade returns for March show an increase in the exports compared with last year of £560,000. The imports in February, £18,148,000 against £15,496,000 in the same month of last year.

The visit of Prince Arthur to Londonderry has been accompanied by rioting of a serious character. The disturbance seems to have arisen from the manifestations of the "prentice boys," which were followed, first by stone throwing, and then by pistol shots. One or two men were killed, and others were seriously injured.

Another outrage is reported from Ireland. On Wednesday Captain Tarleton was shot dead on his estate near Athlone, and that he anticipated some violence is shown by the fact that a loaded revolver was in his belt when the crime was committed. Several suspected persons have been arrested.

It was supposed in Paris that an extraordinary session of the Legislative Corps would be summoned for the 15th of June when the Budget for the city of Paris would be taken into consideration.

The latest rumor about the intended trip of the Empress Eugenie is that Her Majesty intends passing three months in Palestine, first being present at the inauguration of the Suez Canal.

His Majesty the Emperor has proposed the following bases for the settlement of the Franco-Belgian Railway difficulty, which, it is believed, will form the ground-work of a satisfactory and peaceable settlement of the question at issue between the two Governments.

There is nothing new to note in the Peninsula. New difficulties are daily cropping up, and a satisfactory extrication from the present state of things is looked upon as being very uncertain.

General Garibaldi has, it is said, written a letter to General Prim, advising him to "talk less and do more."

The King of Prussia in reply to Count Serriener, who presented to him the report of the International Congress on the treatment of the wounded on the field of battle, said that the adoption of the noble idea of declaring neutral all hospitals for the sick and wounded in time of war did the Congress high honor, although he felt firmly convinced that a long time would elapse before it became necessary to apply it practically; a day would, however, come when it would prove an additional bond between nations.

The President and his little army are at Las Piedras, within an hour's journey of the city, and it is likely he will remain there for some days, either to watch the course of events or to await reinforcements and supplies preparatory to taking the field in reality against the rebels.
