Mansilla received despatches from the commanders of the several columns, reporting their arrival at the pointindicated, without other mishap than a soldier who fell sick, and the loss of some horses that strayed away, besides the desertion of some men on the road, as usual on such occasions. The soldiers had no winter clothing and were often destitute of water, yet they marched on cheerfully, a glass of caña being served round to each man every

The Commission, dearcos to extend to the whole City the advantages of the Water Supply, has determined on reducing the cost of laying pipes in the streets not yet provided with them, to eight thousand dollars currency per square, which is the nett cost of laying the main pipes, without branches. In exchange for the advance of that sum, the Commission will declare 'vales,' which will be available for paying for the water in any part of

the city.

In this way, by an advance of a sum equivalent to three hundred dollars currency, for a
house of ten varas frontage, the inhabitants will

house of ten varas frontage, the innactions obtain—

1. The advantage of a supply in their houses (they paying the cost of the service pipe), at a very cheap rate, namely, three per cent. on the rent of the house.

2. Security against fires, which will be insured by placing at every half-square a fire-cock, which will command an unlimited supply of water.
3. The means of watering the streets.

Every information required on the subject of the Water Supply, will be given at the Office of the Commission, 106 Bolivar.

NOTE. The Rent of Houses, inhabited by owners, or let at rates disproportionate to their size or value, will be estimated by an Agent of the Commission; for the purpose of fixing the monthly charge, the owner having the right of appealing to the Commission if the valuation appears unjust,
