The wonderful part of the farce in this little town seems to be the zealous exertions in favour of Tolosa by the Sub-Receptor, Don Antonio Lopez, who was left by Tolosa as his 'encargado de todo,' and amongst other duties that devolved upon our Sub-Receptor was that of gathering up men to send to his patron; but all the come-able in the shape of Orientals had been carried off; he tried to send him some Argentine citizens, but they rebelled, and he had to let them alone. However he put his father-in-law, Don Martin Castillo, in as Post-master.

It is difficult to understand these people. It is not at all likely that Lopez will be removed by the general government. He is a kind of jackal for the Receptor General of the Department, Don Angel Hernandez de Colonia; who is sure to keep him in. It is extremely useful to have a 'chapo' that is smart at the business, and who don't want to keep all the stray pickings to himself.

The post is a good one—60 dollars salary in a small town where beef is only 6 cents the arroba, and where a good house that would cost 100 patacons a month in Montevideo can be had for 10 dollars, is equal to 200 dollars salary in Montevideo. Then the stray pickings probably amount to a good deal more. I should suppose some two or three hundred dollars, which, even though it may have to be divided, would still leave a good figure. Sheep have been dying on this side in great numbers, owing to the immense quantity of rain that has fallen and the consequent high and unwholesome grass.

At present the mortality amongst them is less than it was, and if we have good weather for another fortnight, it is probable that the mortality amongst them will disappear altogether.

All grazing animals on this side are poor in flesh at present.

The bond market ruled firm to-day. The bulls bought up everything on time. For cash the sales only amounted to 1,000 at 68; but for Saturday prices ruled very stiff, and very heavy sales made; in fact it was said that over 300,000 bonds will be delivered 'effective' on that day. The bulls continue to have money; but there is a growing tightness in the market, and many anticipate very soon a rise in the rate of interest. For the 30th June the sales to-day were very heavy, 330,000; price opened at 69, fell off to 68, and finally closed at 68. For July 31st the sales amounted to 50,000 at 67, and for August, and September 20,000 each month at 67. Total sales to-day 593,000.

The rumored interview between Lopez and the Prince was officially contradicted to-day. The news, however, from Paraguay was regarded as most important. The shipment of horses and hay continues; several vessels are at present loading in Zarate.

There was much said respecting the proposed bill in the Provincial Legislature, giving effect of the Deposition \$50,000 mpc. per annum. The measure is regarded as most impolitic, and even improper, owing to the low state of the Treasury, and should it pass the house, it is hoped that Governor Castro will have sufficient spirit to veto it.

The question of the Riachuelo and the Rose is again uppermost. To-day there was much said respecting the very excellent plans drawn up by Mr. C. E. Robertson for the proposed company formed by Mr. Younger. The total cost of the works will be only 2,000,000. We understand that the plans will shortly be laid before the Governor.
