THE PROJECTED PAPER-MILL

It is a good sign to see new industries springing up in the country, and before long we shall probably have a number of manufactures. Messrs. Carulla's cloth-factory and Sr. Arenales' paper-mill will lead the way for many others. Meantime it is expedient that every precaution should be taken to ensure the success of the projects now in hand, and for this end we venture to make some remarks on the proposed paper-mill.

The meeting of the Sociedad Rural was attended by only 8 persons, who listened to Sr. Arenales' report, containing many estimates and details which shows how attentively he has studied the matter in all its bearings. Nevertheless, it must be remembered that Sr. Arenales is not a scientific man, and consequently his theories and studies lack the weight that we look for in an enterprise of the kind-We can positively state that there are parties willing to come forward with large subscriptions, if Sr. Arenales s puts his project in a more tangible form, by the aid of some experienced engineer. That the industry is called for is a fact beyond denial. That it would pay well is almost equally certain. There are, however, difficulties

which must be foreseen. It seems to us that the factory should be established, not in this city, but in the islands of the Parana, where water costs nothing, where Nature furnishes much raw material; for we can hardly expect that Buenos Ayres will supply rags enough for the demand; grass, straw, thistles, foliage, &c., make excellent paper.


