THE BANK LIQUIDATION IN MONTEVIDEO.

The Montevidean Government has just issued the following important

Montevideo, July 26, 1869.

July of the Present Year.

The liquidation of the banks having peen ordered by law, which is to be carried out immediately after promulgation, and as it is necessary to clear up doubtful points, and remove all difficulties that have obstructed its execution, the President of the Republic, with the advice of his Ministers, Decrees:

Art. 1. For the intervention required by Art. 3. of the law, the legal re presentative of a bank, in the case of an unlimited liability company ['sociedad en comandita,'] is the acting partner or partners; and in the case of a limited liability company ['sociedad anonima,'] the committee or the directory expressly authorised by the shareholders, convened by their actual directors or managers.

Art. 2. Therefore, the Fiscal Commission will request Baron Maua to present himself in person, or through twenty-four hours from the time notice is served upon him, in order to representative of the Bank Maua & Sr. D. All the rights of creditors and shareholders are specially guars anteed to be exercised in the way and form lawfully due, and in no instance can a Bank be rehabilitated against which any claim or action is pending before the tribunals, and until they are resolved by sentence of the Court. Art. 12. In the cases referred to in the preceding articles until any new law shall make any innovation upon the special process to be followed, the Juez Letrado de Con ercio is to apply the actual Law of Banks, the Code and other dispositions in force.

Art. 13. The above dispositions are applicable to the Commercial Bank or Salto, and are to be observed by the Commission charged with its liquidation.
