he following rules are now published in reference to the obligation they are under of having their papers viséd in the various Consulates of this Re-Buenos Ayres, July 26, 1869.

Art. 20-Captains of ships loading in a foreign port from any Argentine port must legalize, through the Ara gentine Consul, the ship's bills of lading, which must specify as far as possible the brands, numbers, casks, and packages, and state the names of the parties to whom the goods are con-

Art. 21-The Consul will issue the certified manifest, having first compared it with the invoice, detailing each article comprising the cargo.

Art. 22-If the captain have cargo for different ports in the Republic, lie must have a manifest for each port, and the Consul will vise them each separately, and in the form already laid down.

Art. 23-Ships coming in ballast to any port of the Republic must make a declaration to this effect before the Consul, and bring a certificate of

Art. 24-The Cousul will charge acording to the following




