Can anything be more satisfactory than this? With half-a-dozen new 'surtidores,' or public cocks, the rent derived from this source alone will pay six per cent per annum on the cost of the works, without taking into account the revenue derived from private houses supplied with water.

Again, if we look at the Western Railway, we find that no public or private enterprise in the country gives better results; if the nett profits of the year are small, it must be remembered that the fares charged the public are infinitely under those charged by any other railway in the country. It is sufficient to know that the road pays a fair interest on the capital invested, is well managed, and, furthermore, is a great public convenience Opposed as we are to government influence in railways, and such like, we are forced to admit that the country is a direct gainer by the Western Railway being in the hands of the Government. 
