THE MORON FAIR.

Are we better than our ancestors? that's the question. The old stage coach is gone, the fly-boat on the canals is forgotten, even our May poles are cut down, and the once happy fair green is cut up and sold for building lots. We live in an unrecurrent epoch. Antiquity no longer lends a charm to anything, all the sages of bygone years, although great men in their day, fall far short of the men of the period; we wish to believe that we can learn nothing from the past, that the greatest epoch in the world's history is the present, and the less we remember old customs the more qualified are we for the giant march of the present age; but notwithstanding all our progress, all our steam engines, telegraphic wires and balloon ships, how often are we brought to a halt and forced to retrace our steps, to initiate a custom which flourished when the Moors held Spain or the Incas governed Peru.

Here we are in the middle of the blessed 19th century trying to establish an agricultural fair, with the elect of Moron teaching the people the rules, customs and usages of fairs. Seven hundred years ago our forefathers in England were busy with the same task. The new fair green of Moron is indeed a sharp lesson to us all, it teaches us that with all our advancement we are dependent on our forefathers for certain customs which lose nothing of their importance by their antiquity.

The inauguration of the Moron fair is to-day; we trust it will prove a success, as agricultural fairs tend to generate a useful emulation in rural districts, which political economists of the right stamp highly value.

Since the memorable Palermo fair which was held under the sunny auspices of the lamented Dr. Alsina and our estimable Post-master general Sr. Posadas, we have had no attempt at a public fair in this country until the present, which, when we consider the purely pastoral and agricultural character of the country is really extraordinary.

Public fairs have been in vogue since the earliest period. The greatest and most celebrated fair in Old England was founded by the Priory and Hospital of St. Bartholomew, in Smithfield, London, about the beginning of the twelfth century. It had the privilege of annually holding a fair for three days, and so important did this fair become, that the gathering of tumbler and mountebanks was forgotten in the great assemblage of business men and the great beauties of the day. There were long rows of booths ranged along the green sward, on which were displayed the beautiful silk fabrics and embroideries of the middle ages, and the delicate filigree of the London goldsmiths; and this renowned fair attracted the attention of all Europe, until the close of the reign of Elizabeth. The English fairs in those days were the great centres of wit, fashion, and beauty. We read of a celebrated merry Andrew, at the Smithfield fair, showing his contempt of the solvency of the Government, by pretending to sing a pig with exchequer notes, and roast it with the lard. What would President Sarmiento's cabinet think if "Gutierrez" or a "Chapeaurouge" resorted to this mode of attack, and yet it was only laughed at on the fair ground.

Could we see on the fair green of Moron to-day as great a crowd as when Guelchto beat Colfax, we should indeed feel increased confidence in our rural prosperity; but somehow our tastes are vitiated—we can crowd Chiramin's Circus to overflowing, but we doubt if we can fill the booths around the fair green of Moron. The experiment is to be tried; it takes place to-day; let us hope it will prove a success. Our public men should muster strong on the occasion; politicians who aim at popularity, and sheepfarmers who sigh for high prices should be in and out every booth. We want something to stir up the public—to bring farming interests to the front. National exhibitions may be all very good in their way, but they are formidable efforts, and more ostentatious than humorous. A good fair green meets the necessity; it will bring us all in contact with the bone and sinew of the country—the farmer. Around the Moron May Pole, let us all meet on a level; let us remember the palmy days when Charles James Fox in his blue coat and buff waistcoat strolled over the fair green, courting popularity even from the acrobats, and the gay and original Goldsmith, who dressed in the most outlandish style, astonished the London tailors and his creditors by the eccentricity of his amusements. Country and town have an equal interest in the success of this Moron Fair; the farmers should muster strong with their produce and their stock, to give interest to the exhibi-

THE SAN CARLOS TRAGEDY.

GOVERNOR CABAL BEFORE THE FEDERAL COURTS. Buenos Ayres, Oct. 28th, To the Editors of the "Standard," Gentlemen,

Every man of feeling in the country must thank you and the "Nazione Italiana" for the articles recently published in the Standard, which have done so much to bring the crime of the San Carlos before the public eye. It was one of the most horrible crimes ever known, and the prompt vengeance taken by the colonists must have a wholesome effect. Governor Cabal seems to have forgotten how deeply the honor of the country is at stake.

THE COUP D'ETAT EXPLAINED. MANIFESTO OF BUSTAMANTE.

The Telegrafo publishes the following letter from Minister Bustamante, which throws much light on the recent occurrences in Montevideo— Montevideo, Oct. 27th.

Sor. D. Antonio Diaz. Dear Sir,

Yesterday I received your letter which I have been unable to answer sooner owing to my numerous occupations. You refer to the interviews you had with me in my house on the days that I happened to have no connection with the Government house, and request me to explain the motives of your visit to me, the nature of your remarks, and the upshot of such interviews. I must first observe that I at once regarded you as a conspirator, since you declared that you "assumed such an attitude as practice has made legal among us." On the 21st inst. just after my resignation you waited on me and began by thanking me and the Government for our conduct at the decease of your illustrious father; then you alluded to the political condition of the country, advising me that the time and occasion required of me to put myself at the head of a revolution, for which end you said I might count on all the necessary elements. You added that when General Caraballo revolted you prepared to support him with 200 men of the Blanco party, but that he refused them; that General Caraballo was brave in the field, although wanting coolness for a fight in the streets of Montevideo; that you considered me a man of strong gills (agallas), just the kind for the work, and that I might count on the same support as you had offered Caraballo. I must confess that at first your proposal seemed a joke or a snare, but seeing your serious manner and remembering the sincerity of your character on various occasions, I treated your offer as serious and replied "that things could not long go on so, that there must be an immediate change of policy, and that the Government must either enforce its orders and make itself respected or cease to exist." I added "Whatever change takes place must be based on the maintenance of the existing authorities, with General Batlle as President of the Republic."

Then you offered me the support of D. Pedro Varela and his friends, without any mention of General Caraballo, adding that you were authorized to make me this offer, which I should not despise. My reply was in these words—"To-day I am wholly separated from the Government, but if a 'revolution occurred to-morrow I would use all my influence to support the Government, or else lock myself up in a garret, or seek asylum in one of the foreign legations." After a few trifling remarks the interview ended and you withdrew, to return again in the evening.
