SPRING MEETING.

Monday had been long named for the fifth celebration of the time-honored Olympian games. The weather which, during the previous week, was unusually fine for the time of the year, proved rather unfavorable on the day named.

From an early hour in the morning, gaily dressed people began to arrive, anxious to secure a good place on the Stand. In the woods some families were encamped beside their carts.

Had it not been for the unpropitious state of the weather the attendance would have been fully as large as it was at the autumn meeting, and even as it was, the Stand was crowded, and a great number of carriages were to be seen on the grounds.

There were several new competitors; among them, one lately arrived from England, with a well established reputation, backed by his having carried off prizes as a member of one of the crack clubs of England.

An innovation was introduced, which met with decided approval. Instead of the prizes being given away by a lady at the end of the day's proceedings, each prize was given after the event by different ladies, who were handed by the table of prizes by the president, Mr. Moore.

The table on which the prizes were displayed offered a gorgeous sight, as these were more than usually tasteful and valuable. Indeed, we are informed that the Buenos Aires Athletic Society leaves far behind any similar society in England for the richness of the prizes they compete for.

The Stand was badly filled—most ladies preferring to remain in their carriages, owing to the threatening state of the weather. For this reason, probably, H. E. President Sarmiento did not attend.

DEPARTURE OF THE AUNIS.

Owing to the change in the service of the English and French mail steamers, the French packet Aunis leaves the River Plate this month nine days before her usual time.

There are now no less than eight different lines of steamers plying between Europe and the River Plate. Those from France and the Mediterranean invariably come out crowded with French and Italian immigrants; in fact, this is the chief immigration which the River Plate enjoys.

The reports in the newspapers are not quite correct. Three of Lefebre's children escaped death; a boy of four years of age who had hid himself, and recognized one of the murderers, a little girl and an infant in the arms of his mother.

Two other murderers were the brothers of Larcon, gauchos also, who have lately perpetrated a murder near Santa Cruz.

There has been no encounter between Indians and Colonists, but the day after the deed the colonists went to the Sauce with the intention either of avenging Lefebre's death or of asking Denis to deliver up the assassins.

Cabal went with troops to the Colony and to Saucito make peace, and put the people to rest as much as he could. He carried back seven or eight colonists who have been here in custody till now but will be released to-day, so I trust.

The whole affair is a sad and serious one and the Government must needs take measures to prevent further collision. The Indians of Sauce and all the military "contones" composed of criminals and scoundrels, ought to be removed out of the neighbourhood of the colonists.

On Sunday, by the first train, about 400 people left for Moron, and the active manager, Mr. Allen, fearing another crowd, such as the Colfax affair, made arrangements to run special trains during the day.

The little village of Moron was astir at a very early hour; all the members of the town corporation were attired in Sunday costume; flags were flying from the house-tops, and upon the whole, it was evidently a great day for Moron.

On the arrival of the Governor's special train.

Mr. T. B. Coffin, with the members of the Municipality, received His Excellency on the platform. The Governor was accompanied by his eldest son, also by Dr. Agrelo, Judge of the Supreme Court; Col. —, Mr. Charles Casares, Messrs. Solvayra, Luis Martinez, and others.

The political state of affairs in Montevideo has given great alarm, and numerous political refugees have arrived at Buenos Ayres. The Montevideo Government has resorted to these extreme measures, owing to a widespread conspiracy which has been recently detected.

In exchange there has been scarcely anything done since the sailing of the English packet, and it is probable that owing to the early departure of the Aunis all the usual exchange operations for the French packet will be postponed until the sailing of the English mail steamer Douro, which leaves this month on the 15th instant.

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THE NEW FLORES ROAD.

The members of the 'Standard Club,' to the number of 24, had a picnic on Monday at Palermo. Monsieur Je Chevalier Noel leaves in the next French packet for Europe.

We will publish to-morrow the list of horses entered for the Jockey Club meeting at Belgrano on the 15th.

We may mention for the benefit of the labouring classes daily arriving in great numbers on our shores from Europe, that just at present there is a great dearth of unskilled and unskilled, in Cordoba.

Every thing continues quiet in town, but the advices from Paysandu speak of an invasion expected from Entre Rios in the first week of November.

Our colleague the 'Capital' of Rosario, a paper that has always been remarkable for the moderation and soundness of its views on political subjects, advocates peace at any price with Paraguay.

The total arrivals of sheep and lamb skins in the Onuca de Comercio market between the 25th of 30th of last month reached 22,500 skins, and in the Plaza de Comercio early last week were 52,500 sheep destined for the granaries.
