The City of Rio de Janeiro arrived today. The following is a summary of her news:

New York, Oct. 1, 1869. Gold closed at 130 1/2, the highest quotation during the day being 130 3/4, the lowest 129 1/2.

Sterling exchange on London 108. Paris, Oct. 1. The Empress Eugenie left Paris yesterday en route for the East.

London, Oct. 1st 1869. Tallow, the market has been steady to-day at 47 on the spot, 48s. 3d. to 48s. 6d. October to December 48s. 6d. buyers, December 48s. 6d. to March and 48s. 9d. to 49s. March.

Manchester, Oct. 1st. The leading features of the market are again fatness and depression. To-day it appears almost impossible to effect sales at all in any class of manufactured goods.

EMILIO CASTRO. ANTONIO E. MALAVER. PEDRO AGOTE. EDITOR'S TABLE. The Royal Mail steamship City of Rio de Janeiro, Captain Peters, Royal Naval Reserve, Commander, arrived in Montevideo early this morning with the English and Belgian mails, and dates to the 3rd ultimo. She experienced fearful weather across the Atlantic, and on the 30th, when she left Rio, the steamship Kepler had not arrived there, although she started three days before her.

Nothing of importance has transpired in the Banda Oriental since last advices. A Presidential decree has been published accepting the resignation of Colonel Rebollo, Minister of War, and naming as his successor Col. Póssolo. The Legislature of Corrientes has passed a law granting an amnesty for all political offences committed during the revolutionary troubles of last year. The amnesty is unconditional.

The British Club, Royal Standard, intends giving a 'picnic' on the 11th inst. (Thursday). This club was inaugurated on the 8th September, 1869, and we are glad to note that only three seats are unoccupied of the limited number. We believe the appointed site for the picnic will be Floresta. Advices from the West Coast state that on the 6th of last month a violent shock of earthquake was experienced at Valparaiso at half-past three o'clock in the afternoon.

A curious edict has been published by the Municipality of Asuncion respecting the removal of vassara from the houses. It appears that the carts only go their rounds on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays, and the public are admonished by the civic sages that only the refuse of these days will be removed! What is to be done with that of Sunday, Tuesday, and Thursday is not stated.

THE SAN CARLOS COLONY. Gentlemen, I have written to you yesterday very hurriedly, only for not missing the occasion of the steamer; but having more leisure to-day, I will avail myself of it to give you more particulars.

I have spoken with the brother-in-law of Lefebre, a colonist, named Place, who lives at a short distance from the place where the crime has been perpetrated. He rode to Lefebre's house as soon as the unfortunate news reached him, and found his sister lying on the ground, before the house, with the infant still in her arms, and the little girl holding her by the head, clinging to her and saying: "mother is not dead." Indeed, the poor woman was still alive, but she did not recognize her brother, and ceased to exist a few moments afterwards.

Mr. Billinghurst will bring to the Chamber on the 15th inst. all the magnificent furniture belonging to M. le Chevalier de Noel, French Minister, who leaves on the 30th for Europe. The sale will take place at the Minister's residence in Calle Larga. The 'Regeneracion' of Asuncion gives an appalling account of the state of misery existing in Paraguay. In the country parts, in the cottages of the poor, corpses have been found lying, lying, and standing postures, all dead from hunger.

An ingenious robbery has been perpetrated in Montevideo. The thief took lodgings in a jeweller's shop in Calle Treinta y Tres on the upper floor, and having made a hole in the ceiling descended on a certain night and swept off 15,000 hard dollars worth of watches, rings, precious stones, &c. he has not yet been captured.

Barracas. The residents down there wanted to know, what about the much talked of tramway? It was rumored yesterday that Mr. Sichel had been again brought before the Court, and compelled to give two sureties for his due appearance when called for.

The killing of sheep and capones during the present year is generally believed to be heavier than at any previous period. Yesterday we were favored with returns from the tablada at San Martin, which gives the following:—Sheep and capones passed for saladeros, since Jan. 1, 1869, to Oct. 31, 1869—1,381,678.

Yesterday there was little done in the wool markets. Buyers are waiting advices from Europe, also from the arrival of some prime lots said to be coming in. The price paid in the South Market, as usual, takes the lead, and rules from seven to ten dollars higher than paid in the Once de Setiembre.

A broker reports 56 offered yesterday for a fine lot of wool from Welchman's, in the South, and refused. Nevertheless, several lots have been sent into deposit, the brokers being unable to get a higher bid than 40.

Has Mr. Varela left, or not, for Brazil? Opinion is so divided on the subject that our esteemed Foreign Minister must show himself, in order to convince some that he is still in town. On Wednesday he bid good-bye to everyone in the Government House; even the very National Government organ, the 'Nacional,' officially announced his departure; yet it seems that the 'Tribuna' at least believes he is still here. The fact of the matter is, that it is impossible to judge of the movements of the Minister until one sees the auctioneer in the house. We trust when H.E. Sr. Varela does go to Rio he will take a run out to Bennett's at Tijuca—the only spot in South America worth visiting. We commend H.E. to the kind attention of Mr. Bennett, who, doubtless, will propose a trip to the Peak of Tijuca. But with such weighty matters on the brain as the Paraguayan war, the Minister would do well not to attempt the Peak. Better limit the excursions to Piedra Bonita or the Chinese view.

In reply to a communication this day received from Salto, Banda Oriental, respecting the paving stones facing the Cathedral, we may say that they were brought from Brazil some few years ago, and placed there by the Baron de Campy. The Plaza Once de Setiembre tramway is rapidly progressing. It will pass down Calles Cuyo and Cangallo. Already near the Plaza the track is laid down for many squares. The line belongs to Señor Rodriguez.

few of them were taken prisoners and brought before the Judge, but they always escaped after a short time, and went back to the Sauce, where they stood under Denis's protection, and found every facility for pursuing their criminal mode of living. Knowing all this from experience, it was very natural that the colonists resolved to take justice in their own hands, and go to Sauce to get hold of the criminals. But as I told you yesterday, the mode in which they effected this expedition was anything but manly and dignified, for they went without order and more like a gang of drunkards and revellers than like orderly and respectable people. There seems to have been nobody to lead and advise them well, and the colonists themselves seem to have been unable to organize themselves in a proper way. This want of order is a great defect, and might, in case of any serious alarm, be the cause of their ruin, though they can muster now a pretty large number of able-bodied men, and would be fully able to defend themselves, if well ordered and commanded.

There has been no encounter between Indians and colonists, Governor Cabal went to San Carlos with troops from Santa Fé, in time to prevent it, Colonel Rodriguez, was at Sauce heading the Indians, who had united there from several cantonments, and he had an order from the Government not to move. The Indians had promised to remain quiet. When Cabal went to the colony he endeavored to calm the effervescence of the colonists to reassure them, but at the same time to make them comprehend that their own act against Denis, was anything but lawful. For this last reason he took seven or eight colonists with him to put them in prison here, but they were released yesterday (28th), with a friendly admonition from Minister Trionala, excepting one who had struggled bodily with Denis, wrenching his sword out of his hand, and holding him fast in his arms whilst the others, finished to kill him; another who being "Comisario" of the colony took a very active part in fringing about the expedition and thereby infringed his official duty, and a third who is a European without being a colonist, and who was living at Esperanza for the time being. This young gentleman who is very well liked and respected here, is not guilty of anything, except having gone to San Carlos with the colonists of Esperanza who went to assist their countrymen; but the Government dislike him because he is a great friend of Orofio, and they accuse him of fomenting the colonists against the present administration, which do not believe to be true, because it would be very unwise on his part as no good can come of it. Be that as it may, this Government now has taken this opportunity to vex and annoy him as much as they can. It is here that the young men in question, in heading a deportation, from the colonists of Esperanza, to the Governor at San Carlos, used unrespectful language towards him.

Whilst the Governor was assuring the colonists that they had nothing to fear from the Indians, there came a man on horseback bringing the news that the Indians were marching against the colony. An alarm immediately spread about in the colony, and the colonists at first doubted whether they ought to consider Cabal's soldiers as friends or foes. Any imprudent or hasty shot would have brought about a battle between them, but fortunately nothing of the kind occurred. Cabal ordered his force to march toward the Indians and intimate them the order to go back to their homes. Denis has left three sons, two of them are not much better than their father, but the third is said to be a peaceable and orderly character, who always used to disagree with his father, on account of the protection he afforded to criminals. To the latter the Governor has confided the charge of temporarily supplying his father's place. They say that he has already sent in to Santa Fé three or four of the individuals whom the Government hitherto claimed in vain. Of course I cannot tell how far this fellow may be trusted, and at all events there remain his two brothers who are dangerous men, and are capable of seeking to avenge their father's death.

The Government ought to take measures to prevent any collision between the colonists and the gauchos in the frontiers. The people of Sauce should be sent to some distant point, and the lands sold to colonists who would make a flourishing town of that miserable village or toll-dwell, within a few years. The spot is well situated, it is the first station on the road to Cordoba and might trade very much be improved at this murder. Since a year or two there have been several cases of colonists who were killed by Gauchos or Indians. At Esperanza, about a year ago, a family of the name of Guerin had fallen victims to them; and of late five bodies of murdered colonists, who were found in the camp or in the wood around the colony, have been buried within one single week. I am told that many cases of this nature have occurred of late, but never has one of the assassins been punished. A separate department or district, with

I must begin by requesting your kind indulgence for my English, but I consider you would have more trouble in translating than in correcting my Andalusian style.

I am afraid the report of the committee is too long for publicity in your columns, and therefore as I wish your readers may have an extract of it, I will try to give you an idea of the principal items interesting for the community.

Afterwards, and if this is too long an "epistle," I will give you in another the palpitant news of this interesting place.

The first feature which calls our attention must be the fact that we must destroy officially a mistake which is spread in most of our leading and thinking men, viz: that when the National Government left this Capital, the town was dead, and solitude, was, with poverty or share.

When that happened, the town forcibly presented a more lovely physiognomy; but as it has a life of its own, as it did not depend upon transitory prosperity, we can now show as a proof, several figures which come forward in the report of the committee.

2nd. Since the Capital of the Republic was taken away, we have read and heard many vulgarities about the unpopularity of the place...

3rd. Since the departure of the Government, the rent of the houses came down as a matter of course, and we were induced to believe that it was easy to live almost for nothing.

4th. The increase in population results from the data furnished by the census:

From 1859 to date 7,988 born Against 3,419 dead

Population in town and suburbs 9,832 Camp 8,053 Villa Guizua colony 698

Total of the department 18,583 souls

Of which 4,860 know how to write, say 261 men, 5,503 do do read, 298 men, 1,514 go to school, 8 men

The honorable members of the Committee, Doctors Nicolar Molinas, Antonio Zarco and Manuel M. de Fontes, have been very upright and just in their interesting report when they state that the improvements remarked, the progress which is to be noted in a great proportion due to the cooperation of our excellent and honest chief of Police, Don Domingo Comas, whose activity and great sympathies secure for him the highest esteem from all and every inhabitant of this department...

When we see what occurs with our Santa Fé neighbors, in their riots and continued hostilities with the colonists, we cannot praise too much the blessings of having as authorities, honest, respectable and good hearted men, unable to harm anybody and disposed always to help the prosperity of those placed under their guard.

Perhaps you may think we are passionate in our preceding paragraph, but on the contrary, the friendship with which we are favoured by Mr. Comas prevents us from saying all that he deserves as Chief of Police, as an honorable gentleman, as an excellent father, husband, and citizen.

Now we feel it our duty on examination of the report of the committee, to inform your readers that we are not in accordance with the calculations made about the number and class of cattle, and we suppose that said gentlemen have taken information from official declarations of the owners when they pay the Direct tax.

They give, 263,460 head of horned cattle, 67,000 horses and mares, 142,126 sheep. While according to our own observations and experience we can show as more near the truth the following figures:

450,000 head of cattle, 365,000 sheep, 100,000 mares and horses.

We do not give these numbers to induce the renter of the taxes to doubt what everybody pays now, but we can sustain, that we have made our calculations upon very approaching data.

We have noted also an omission which we consider a very important one, in not mentioning the depot of agricultural machines and implements belonging to Mr. Suarez, agent for Ransomes Sims & Heeds of Ipswich, situated in Calle General Ramirez, which is certainly worth publicity, as far as agriculture is so intimately concerned with our future prospects.

We have noted another omission in not mentioning a fair agricultural establishment carried on by our mutual friend, Mr. Salustino Puente, who keeps there a number of families working and improving the place. Some few days ago we saw landing fourteen persons coming from Denmark, for that interesting settlement where he sustains now about thirty.

If we mention those omissions, it is not our view to mean that the report of the committee is not well done, we would have made those observations had we had a knowledge of the report before publication.
