It was only when Curupaity was almost abandoned, in March 1868, that the steamers Mage aud Belieribe passed up from Curuzú to join the ironclads; no other wooden vessel did so.

There is no evidence that the Admiral considered himself in jeopardy in his new position after passing up by Curupaity, much less that he asked permission to come down again to his old anchorage at Curuzú as you affirm. On the contrary, I always heard the Admiral say that we must hold at any cost the position won on Aug. 15th. 
