The Earl of Derby died on October 23, after a painful illness of twelve

days, during which his death was hourly expected. From October 17 up

to the hour of his death the deceased took no nourishment, and remained in a

state of unconsciousness for almost the whole of the time. He had been

suffering from a severe attack of the gout. Her Majesty made daily enquiries

after his health. England has thus lost one of her foremost men, who will

be ever remembered for the part he took in the emancipation of the

West India slaves. His death is generally regretted by all classes of society.

He expired without any signs of physical suffering. He is succeeded in his title by Lord Stanley, who is

forty-three years of age, and unmarried.

The disturbances in Spain have not been renewed. The fact seems to be

established that the rebels were supported with means by some interested

Cubans, the "quid pro quo" being Cuban independence in the event of the

rebellion proving successful. Now that the Cortes have resumed their sittings,

it is to be hoped the Cuban question will be fairly taken in hand, and

disposed of at once and for ever. Should the Cortes go with General Prim, and

decide to elect a king, he could not better inaugurate his reign than by

proclaiming Cuban independence. General Prim is working hard in the

direction of consolidating the hitherto disjointed state of affairs, and has

a well merited tribute to the bravery of the army and navy in defence of the

Government and the people.

The Protestant Bishop, Dr. Albama, and several other Protestants, have

been arrested in the Evangelical Church at Grauada. Their arrest is

said to be due to political reasons.

Intelligence from Cuba announces that the Captain-General has suspended

all the magistrates of Havana for abuses of their judicial functions.

Dalmatia has had its little rebellion, and its peasantry, instead of cultivating

maize, rye, barley, olives, and figs, have taken to their rifles and their

mountains. The Dalmatians are no mean shots, and the desperate nature

of their resistance may be gathered when we state that it was found necessary

to use artillery to dislodge them from the heights near Risano. The

advantages hitherto have been on the side of the Government.

It is a significant sign of the times that there has been some talk of the

unemployed working men of London forming themselves in "double rows"

in the streets through which Her Majesty the Queen will pass on the

occasion of her visit to the city, on the 6th of November, to open the new

Blackfriars Bridge and the Holborn Viaduct. The foot and mouth disease is

gradually spreading over the country, and it is feared that farmers and

others will have to sustain severe losses. It is said to have been imported

from the Continent, where it prevails to an immense extent. The

disease has long been known to veterinary surgeons. In 1837 it committed

great ravages among the cattle, and in 1844-54 it broke out among the

Mr. Gladstone has replied to the memorial of the Limerick Amnesty

EDITOR'S TABLE

The Galileo brought us a most agreeable piece of news. A telegraph cable is to be laid down between Lisbon and Rio Janeiro. A line between Montevideo and Rio must soon follow, and the River Plate will then be in communication with North America, India, in fact, with all points that are linked to any part of the Old Continent by the electric wires. A vast change in our trade prospects will be effected by this great enterprise.

We salute most cordially our new colleague La Discusion, wishing it a long and prosperous career. It begins well by a sharp attack on our judicial system and the Supreme Court, in which public censure is invoked as the most effectual means of bringing the Bench to order.

A number of people accompanied the French Minister, Mons. Noel, and other friends, on board the Girondo on Tuesday; they got a good drenching on returning to shore, just catching the first of the rain storm on that evening. The Girondo is expected, when her machinery gets into proper working order, to make the run from Europe to Montevideo in twenty-four days.

The cause of maestro Fumi's retiring from the direction of the orchestra at the Opera House is said by a colleague to have been his unpopularity with the artistes of the Company, though his great abilities were duly recognised by all.

A wager has been made between two sporting gentlemen, one English, the other a Porteno, as to the exact distance between the 'ombú' at the foot of the Recoleta hill, and that at the foot of the barranca at Belgrano, near the church. The Englishman considers it less than fifty squares, the Argentine says it is much more.

Colonel Mansilla has caused small chapels to be built at each of the garrison posts under his command on the Cordoba frontier; he has applied to Government for bells for these chapels. They are making some splendid wine in Chile this year. A city merchant, Sr. Chenaut, has introduced some elegant made there, which is said to be equal to the best Bordeaux.

Yesterday morning Baron Maua arrived from Montevideo. We salute H.E. and congratulate him on the successful termination of the banking crisis which has so long afflicted the Oriental Republic. Of all the banks compelled to go into liquidation by that crisis, the Maua Bank is the only one that has withstood the shock, and is now in a position to re-open. Salaristas, estancieros, and those connected with the real industries of the country, hail with pleasure the reopening of a bank which has ever proved the tried friend of every sound enterprize and business in that country.

The new Parque Railway station will be publicly inaugurated in a few days; it is really an ornament to the city. The old rails at the station are now being pulled up, and yesterday morning the trains had to start on the wrong track, but this is nothing.

The Count D'Eu and Mr. Paranhos may be expected down in a few days; the captain has dropped, footholds extinguished, nothing left but the pulley and the beam.

The Memnon may be expected here about the 14th December; she will bring dates from Liverpool of 10th November, and from Havre 14th November. She returns to Havre for which port she has a large portion of her cargo engaged. She comes consigned to Messrs. John Boyd & Co. The Memnon has not been here for several years, but in the interim she has had a complete overhaul, and has received new engines and boilers.

A woman was stabbed in the arm a few days ago in the Plaza Onco de Setiembre by a vagrant gaucho; she expired almost instantly. Sad to say the assassin, as usual, made his escape. We notice in a colleague's report that the Provincial Government is about to adopt the European system in the prisons, and force the convicts to work in their cells at whatever labour they may be acquainted with or prefer to learn. This measure is of course a good one, but if greater care be not exercised in looking after their safe custody than hitherto, it will certainly prove an additional incentive to attempts at escape.

We observed a few mornings ago a dead horse lying suspiciously close to the door of a butcher's stall in Calle Santa Fé; the coincidence caused as most unpleasant sensations and destroyed our appetite for breakfast, for we are by no means advocates of hippophagy.

On Wednesday the ordeal so much dreaded by Argentine school boys commenced; the public examinations began on that day, and the result of the year's teaching at the different colleges and preparatory schools will now be made apparent. The sanitary state of the city is reported as excellent, within the last fortnight the deaths averaged only from 10 to 12 per diem, a low rate for such a large city as Buenos Ayres.

Two street scavengers had a dispute on Tuesday which soon came to blows; a stab from a knife by one of them disabled his adversary, who died next day in the hospital.

The small corps of detective police organised some time ago by Mr. O'Gorman, do good service in their way from time to time. They made a descent on a notorious "hell" in Calle Caugallo the other night. Each stranger present was fined \$100mc paid 'al contado,' and the owner of the house and proprietor of the roulette table \$500mc each. Fines are but of slight avail in these cases; such establishments should be closed for good.

The last accounts from Paraguay represent Lopez, as wandering about the country with his 3,000 followers taking no decided direction, and in fact, as not knowing well where he was going. The Brazilians are said by a Paraguayan officer who deserted to our lines a fortnight ago, to be close at his heels. Lopez endures all the misery of a common soldier, and is said to suffer much from the insects which abound in the Sierras. His army is halt starved, one ox is allowed as rations for 200 men, and when meat fails, a few bitter oranges are served out to each man.

The following paragraph which we take from an English colleague looks bad for the meat preservers:—Eighty Acan carcasses, which were shipped in South America, by the mail steamer City of Buenos Ayres, and preserved with ice, sawdust, and charcoal, were thrown overboard 30 days after shipment, the meat having turned and become unfit for the London markets, and the experiment failed.

Affairs in Santiago del Estero look rather gloomy, and it is feared that Taboada may give some trouble; no doubt however, exists as to the ability of the National Government to cope vigorously with any difficulties that may arise.

Madame Carozzi, on arriving in Montevideo from this city, was received by a number of her friends at the landing pier, and escorted to her hotel by the lively strains of a brass band.

A meat preserving company is talked of here on the Olden system, which obtained prizes at the last exhibitions in Paris and London.

A buoy is about to be placed over the sunken wreck lying at the Punta del Indio. This simple precaution should be taken in the case of every wreck or in near this port, many disasters would thus be avoided.

The earthworks on the branch line from Merlo to Lobos have now nearly reached the latter place; the laying of the rails will be at once commenced. In a couple of months the line will be thrown open to the public.

Some North wools sold yesterday as high as 60, being the highest price in that plaza this season.

A few Lincoln sheep lately imported at such expense by one of our most enterprising farmers, will be sold to-day by Messrs. Balbin & Plowes. They are, for size of body, and strength of constitution, by far the finest animals ever yet brought to this country. They are more remarkable for their flesh and grease than wool; one of their cross gave as much as 65lbs of grease when melted down. The skin is on exhibition at the Rural Society rooms.
