It is not sufficient that the poor farmer has to struggle against variable seasons, dear labour, Indian invasions, and gaucho 'emeutes,' he must now fight the political vampires of a wretchedly poor and thinly populated province. This tax is infamous, unjust, and illegal—infamous, because from the hard-earned gains of the poor farmer the pampered officers of a Provincial State try to raise funds to maintain them in expensive idlenessunjust, because this tax falls solely and absolutely upon one particular branch and illegal, because it amounts to an export tax, which only Congress can impose. The farmers are, therefore,

fully justified in resisting payment to the last. But is Mr Sarmiento the man to allow such an imposition? His iufluence, it properly used, is sufficient to get it abolished. May we trust that his own good sense will point to the line of conduct which the country ex-

> LATEST FROM PARAGUAY. CONFLICT WITH THE ITALIAN

GUNBAOT. The Regeneracion of the 28th ult. gives the following news from Asuncion. On Friday morning (26th) the Italian Consul, Lorenzo Chapperon, who had taken refuge some days before aboard the Italian gunboat 'Ardita,' while accused of embezzling a quantity of property belonging to Paraguayan families, tried to ship his luggage privately aboard the passenger steamer Venezia, preparatory to leaving the country. Sor Ferreyra, the Port Captain, being aware of the attempt, seized 5 large boxes aboard the Venézia and sent them ashore; he was in the act of unshipping 2 more boxes when his boat was attacked by an armed cutter from the Ardita, under Directors. the command of an Italian officer. The Port Captain had only two men with him, so that the Italians were able to carry off the boat and boxes along 40\$000 premium. with the two Paraguayan sailors, while Consul Chapperon was looking on fects which the Paraguayan families chased by private speculators. had entrusted to his keeping.
