Sichel, is as to the legality of his contracts-contracts are sometimes said to be allegal, either because the consideration of the promise is illegal, or because the promise itself is illegal. But neither the promise nor the consideration in the present, case can be charged as illegal, his business ransactions were carried on in the nost open manner, and in the mos public place in Buenos Ayres. Custom or common law lent legality to all his proceedings. But, for the light of Gomez Pereira, it is more than probable, instead of being the occupant of a debtors prison, he would be a bond king, holding his levee in the liquidation. The legality of his operations appears by the decision of the court to hang on their success, and this is a very dangerous preedent to establish. The only ground ipon which the decision of the court can rest, is, that bond speculations are immoral, and contracts for their purchase and sale, when carried to a large extent, are in violation of public morality founded upon considerations 'contra bonos mores' and consequent ly void, and this seems to be the safes ground whereau to base the judgment


