THE BROKER'S LIABILITY.

The decision of the Court in the case of Mr. Sichel has to some extent startled the commercial public.

The "Codigo de Comercio," which is the fundamental law in such cases, specifically lays down the duties, obligations, and responsibilities of brokers.

The case of M. Sichel is simply this: he joined the Bolsa as a member and was duly admitted as a broker.

Two Spanish men of war, a frigate and a corvette are expected in Montevideo to-day. Sr. España brother of the Spanish Minister comes in one of them.

Major Loyola, lately condemned by a general court-martial to be cashiered, and to five years imprisonment, has presented a petition to Government praying that the latter part of the sentence be not yet carried out, as he is seriously unwell.

The Nacion denies the accuracy of the census returns for the city of Buenos Ayres, and says that, instead of 180,000 souls, as appears by the returns, the metropolis of the Republic contains upwards of 250,000 inhabitants.

gally put back for the last fourteen days by wet weather. Almost every day we are having tropical showers, however beneficial they may be for the camp, the shearers look upon such weather as an intolerable nuisance.

All over this district the shearing is in progress. The Newtons, who commenced early were nearly finished when the weather changed; a few days more, if the weather keeps good we will have the shearing over, sheep-farmers as a rule are determined to obtain good prices, many are refusing the offers now made to them, trusting that wool will still advance in price.

This is the only way the sheepfarmer can on his part keep up the prices. If many hold out and are not compelled to force the wool upon the markets, it will have at least a slight tendency to keep up prices.

Much chagrin is entertained by the shearers at the reduction of prices, instead of getting fifty per hundred, shearers only get forty, peons in like manner are reduced, this is not but, if wools fall in price it is not to be expected that they should receive the same wages as when wool sold at double the price.

It is a cry at the time; I only hope that next year they will receive the same wages; great animation exists in the camp just now, old clothing has passed away, behold all has become new, gaudy shirts representing all the colours of the rainbow are being worn.

The present is the busiest season, 'pulperias' are busy, every one seems to be in good temper, if I spend all to-day I can work for more to-morrow, such is the present state of things.

There is a great race to-day at the Tigre 'pulperia,' I believe the sum to be run for is \$5,000, one of the Newtons runs; the other his name I forget, when I hear the result I will send same. I may state that this race is causing considerable excitement in the camp.

It is with much regret that I have to inform you that many have lost severely in their potatoe crops this year. Those who tried potatoes for the first time this year, are disgusted, and join the cry of those who maintain that this country is unsuited for growing crops; at home we have the same failures through the same causes.

Here growers must do as they do at home, sow again. The maize promises a first-rate crop this year. The recent rain we have had has done much to bring it forward.

Barley also is doing remarkably well and promises likewise to be a heavy crop. In this quarter those who have fruit trees will reap a good harvest, if nothing unforeseen comes in the way.

I have no fights to record this time, seemingly people are too busy to fight, I trust this state of things in the camp will continue. I regret much to see in the STANDARD that there are so many murders committed in Buenos Ayres, I most heartily join with you in crying out at the great laxity of Government in not endeavouring to put a stop to this state of things.

The inhabitants are very friendly to foreigners, civil and religious liberty prevail in the fullest sense, and treaties of amity and commerce have been concluded with all the great powers. The natural advantages of the country can, indeed, be hardly overrated.

Situated in the south temperate zone, it will breed cattle and sheep, and will grow cotton, wheat, tobacco, yerba mate (a sort of tea), cochineal, wine, sugar, silk, coffee, and fruits of every kind. It contains copper, silver, lead, salt, marble, limestone, granite, and coal.

It is, moreover, magnificently wooded and watered. And in this superabundance the most fertile land is obtainable at absurdly low prices. All that is required is labour, and the government wisely offers every facility to emigrants.

Nor need an emigrant fear that he is coming among an entirely native population. Foreigners have already largely recognised and availed themselves of the amazing natural advantages of the country, and at the present time there are no less than 250,000 foreigners, being half the population, in the province of Buenos Ayres alone.

The authors have endeavored to afford every possible information to intending settlers, giving the acreage and the extent under cultivation, together with the approximate price of land in every locality. For sheep and cattle farming, as well as for agricultural purposes, the capabilities of the country are almost unbounded; at the present time it is estimated that Irish farmers alone possess over 30,000,000 of sheep.

We should advise every one who has any idea of emigrating to study this very interesting book carefully before deciding upon his destination.—London Standard.

Exchange is very firm, and takes look for an improvement of the rate before the packet leaves. In the wool market to-day there was a very active business. The very favorable advices received from the European markets have given rise to active speculation both in the camps and in plazas.

There is now a deal of jobbing in the market. The Oncha will sail on the 16th, Wednesday next; she may take gold to Rio as well as silver; it is supposed to be 20d, but she will not probably take any specie to England as the rate of exchange on London is too high for that, and looks rising.

We extract the following from Leaks Haig's Circular for River Plate wools and sheepskins:— Since the date of my last circular the 21st of the general state of trade is without change throughout the country manufacturers are well employed, but it is only of a hand to mouth character, as they are afraid to accept large orders, on account of the unceremonious prices for goods, and a certainty that wool cannot advance much, as there is no chance of the supply diminishing to such an extent as to leave an insufficient quantity for the demand.

In River Plate wools the transactions have been very limited, only about 150 bales sold, and 1st and 2nd mestizo together at 1 1/2 per lb., and one lot marked G 17 3/4 bales at 1 1/2 per lb., but although prices are again a little better, we cannot hold out much hope of any great improvement. The London Colonial sales will commence on the 11th inst., up to date \$3,200 bales have received, 40,430 bales of these are C 60;—this alone, we think, will have a tendency to check any notable advance in Montevideo or Buenos Ayres wools.

On the 9th and 10th inst., our friends the Messrs. de la Plata, who quantity of River Plate wool to be offered will only be small, and chiefly of an inferior description. In Buenos Ayres Skin Wool (pulled in England) the sales have only been trivial, it being chiefly held for the coming auctions.
