last begnn. In Santa Fé, Entre Rios Corrientes, Cordova and Banda Oriental, reaping is now going on briskly; even in some parts of Buenos Ayres reaping has also commenced. The last storms 'laid' the wheat a little in some places, but upon the whole, the crop is sound, and more still, it is now safe. The estimates of the crop are so various, that it is almost impossible to arrive at any certain data; from the Chuput, in the South, to the district of San Nicolas, in the North, the average under wheat is put down as fully double that of last year. Along the banks of the Plate and Parana, in all the districts near this city, the chief crop is wheat. It appears that long before his retirement from Ascurra a delegation of the Papagua Indians waited upon him and tendered him the service of 7,000 wars riors to assist in resisting the Brazilia ans' invasion. 
