THE SUPREME FEDERAL

The most important tribunal in this country is the Supreme Federal Court. From its decision there is no appeal, and from the very character of the court, almost every case brought beerudition and immense experience. The Mitre administration has left the country no more lasting memorial than this exalted tribunal of justice. The decisions of the various sectional or district judges are in many cases open to much and severe comment, but whenever they clash with law or equity, they are reversed on appeal. In some of the most important cases brought before the court, the decision of the sectional judge has been reversed, which shows the independent chatacter of the court of which we now treat, and which, from the peculiarity of its jurisdiction, may be aptly termed the Foreigner's Court of Appeal; a very interesting collection of reports of cases tried before this court is published by Dr. Tarnassi, which is well worth the attention of our commencial readers. Without the least exaggeration we may assert that, as regards the technical points of law and decisions of the courts, we are all in the dark. In no country in the world is there more of the "glorious uncertainty of the law" than here, and this may be traced to the absence of precedent and the want of reports.

The great case of Day vs. Flores comes up for trial to-day, and the for reign public in the Plate, who have such an important interest at stake in the issue, look with much anxiety to

There never was a clearer or fairer case brought before any tribunal than that of Mr. Day; everything in his declaration or complaint he has proved by responsible and impartial witnesses; the ownership of the cattle their value, the seizure by order of the defendant, who was the Governor of San Juan, and the non-payment of same, either by the Governor, who confiscated them, the officer who carried them off, or the soldiers who eat them; the case of the plaintiff could not be clearer, and the defence of Governor Flores is simply, that he is not esponsible, having been forced to act as he has done, by the revolutionary party then in power. But this, at best, is but a subterfuge, since he himself being Governor, must have been the very head of the party which he now disclaims.

It would seem, indeed, from the deence set up by Governor Flores, that t is the duty and obligation of these Provincial Governments to seize and carry off, at the first signal of a row, all the property of foreigners that they can lay hands on, secure that when order is restored there will be never wanting a judge such as the District Judge of San Juan, Moreille, who will refuse relief to the unfortunte and ruined foreigner. Such decisions tend to corrupt the morals of the people, and lead to an indiscriminate plunder of foreign property in every case of civil revolt or commotion.

That so moustrous a doctrine as this will be sanctioned by the Supreme Federal Court of the Republic we cannot bring ourselves to believe-the case of Mr Day-in San Juan may be that of any other foreigner in the country to-morrow. Should such a precedent be established neither life or property in the upper provinces would be worth ten minutes purchase; the whole apparatus of Government would be at best but a farce, and the sooner foreigners in the provinces packed up and cleared out the better for themselves and all parties concerned; verily we are drifting to a pretty state of affairs.

Never before have we been called on to deal with such an attempt to legalse public robbery; there is no disguising the fact, if Judge Morcillo's decision is allowed to stand, then there is no longer any security for property, justice is but a mockery, and the appetite for foreign property will become so keen that it will be a powerful incentive to revolution. Well may we exclaim poor South America!


