GOVERNOR CASTRO AND THE POLICIA.

The terrible murder which was perpetrated in this city on Thursday night again reminds us of the truly shocking state of our criminal courts; we all are aware of the crime, and on good authority learn that the assassins have been arrested, but we know nothing more; the official information at the police-office is held from the public; even the names of the murderers are guarded as a secret, and what, may we ask, is the motive for all this secrecy, if not to shield the felon or the officer of the law from responsibility.

THE PRESIDENT'S JOURNEY. (From our own Correspondent.) Rosario, Jan. 20. I mentioned in my hurried communication from San Nicolas, we arrived in San Nicolas on Tuesday at half-past one o'clock, and it was determined to wait there for the gunboats, which had been unable to keep up with the Paven. The Decidde was the first to make her appearance, arriving an hour after us and anchoring alongside of us.

Verily we can have no real punishment for crime until we drive the ploughshare over the Policia, and hold the policemen responsible in all such cases, but we fear greatly we look for too high a morality with the elements at our disposal. There is really only one branch of police-office law attended to, and that is the fine system; we hazard the assertion that there is not a city in the world where more fines are collected than in Buenos Ayres, every offence susceptible of a fine we must say is punished, whilst on the other hand crimes that admit of no pecuniary compromise with justice almost invariably escape unpunished; let us yield, therefore, to circumstances, and henceforward establish a fine for murder, for it really seems to be the only way possible, with our police-office and courts as at present organized, to punish murder.

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At 12 we entered the harbour, the Paven coming in first and anchoring in front of the old mole. The scene that met our eyes was truly imposing. The mole, and the ships lying alongside were one compact mass of people, and even their riggings were occupied. The azoteas, the streets leading down to the Port, and all along the barranca overlooking the water as far as the eye could reach crowds could be seen. All the ships in harbour had their riggings decked with flags. As soon as the Paven anchored the Italian gunboat saluted the President's flag with 21 guns, the Paven returned the salute and some other merchant craft also joined. From the shore innumerable rockets and crackers rent the air with their sharp detonation.

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Café Pegrano about six p.m., which was at the time crowded, and told the owner that he would stand treat to all present, and anybody that should come in till 11 o'clock at night. This curious whim cost him over 2,000 hand dollars! A similar thing was done in Buenos Ayres by a Mr Frias, in 1824, who, when the news arrived of the Battle of Agacacho, treated the people of Buenos Ayres for three consecutive days in the Café del Plata.

leaving a deficit of fifteen thousand dollars. The Committee propose to hold a bazaar in September believing that under the circumstances timely help will be forthcoming. The building is situated in the Calle Patagones, and on one of the finest points of the Bay, commanding a view of the Cerro. In the year 1857 it was found to be necessary to provide special accommodation for invalids, mainly owing to the great increase which had taken place in the number of vessels frequenting the port. In 1865, it was resolved to procure larger premises, and for this purpose funds were raised and a hospital, in all respects admirably adapted to meet the necessities and incurring expenses for general management never exceeding the annual income, established. In it there is room for sixty patients. Private patients are received in separate rooms, at the rate of three dollars per day including all expenses. There are also rooms with two beds for which private patients are charged one and a half dollars per day. A reading library on the premises, is at the disposal of the inmates: but at the same time, open to all who become subscribers, at the rate of 80 cents per month, and also to those who give donations of books.

The scene at the peroration was sublimely grand; diplomacy forgot itself, and the Foreign Ministers rushed from their seats to embrace the renowned orator. The Argentine Minister Gorostiga went even still further and three times embraced Mr. Varela. We are opposed to this custom of masculine embraces, our embraces should be reserved for women, but honest enthusiasm and good will will at times disturb all decorum. The scene that occurred on the way home is not surprising at all, people after a banquet generally speaking are very jolly. We can imagine our friends Craufurd, Varela, Gorostiga, all strolling home arm in arm singing stentoriously:— "We went go home till morning, till daylight does appear. "En fin" this Presidential trip promises some spicy anecdotes.
