CITY TRAMWAYS.

The numerous tramways now in construction or about to be commenced will effect a wonderful change in Buenos Ayres, much greater than most people have an idea of.

res, and all the other outlets that are to have tramways running into town every 10 minutes at 3/4 fare per head. In the large towns of England and N. America most people in easy circumstances live out of town; the same is the case in Rio Janeiro, but here in Buenos Ayres we have hitherto been confined to the city, owing to the want of roads or cheap conveyances.

The Americans were the first to introduce tramways into general use, and although some lines have existed in England and France for some years back it is only at the present moment that the furor has invaded the chief towns of Great Britain. The city of London, after resisting the movement with obstinacy, perhaps because a wrinkle of Brother Jonathan's, has at last yielded to the requirements of public convenience, and the great metropolis is now about, to be cut up in all quarters.

The tramways at present in construction in this city are 3 in number, and there are 6 others projected or about to be commenced, viz: 1. Mr. Lacroze's line from the Plaza Once to Paseo Julio, passing down Calle Cagallo; it is made of steel rails and cast-iron sleepers, and will be opened to traffic in a couple of months: cost about £3,000 per mile.

2. The Rodriguez line constructed by Mr. Peter Beare, coming down Calle Cuyo, almost parallel with Lacroze's, now finished down to Calle Suipacha and will be open next month; the station to be at the corner of Cuyo and San Martin: cost £1,600 per mile, without the cars. 3. The Billinghurst line from Cinco Esquinas to Calle Lima, constructed by Mr. Wattel: this line will run on to Plaza Constitucion, Mr. B. buying up the Southern tramway. 4. The Flores line, which Mr. Billinghurst intends to run parallel with the macadamized road: this line is not yet begun. It will only come in to Calle Callao, and omnibuses will carry passengers into the centre of town.

The profits of the enterprises promise to be large. It may be estimated that the annual tramway traffic of Buenos Ayres will not be under 4 million passengers, equal to 12 million 5/8 mpc. or about £100,000 sterling; from this we must take one-half for working expenses, which will leave £50,000 sterling, equal to 50 per cent. per annum on the cost of construction.

LATEST FROM PARAGUAY.

DREADFUL FAMINE AND MORTALITY.

We have dates from Asuncion on Sunday 23rd inst. The accounts of the famine continue to be most heart-rending. At the same time the debauchery going on at Asuncion scandalizes everybody. The nightly orgies termed 'bailes' are so outrageous that the Municipality either to prohibit them altogether or to forbid their occurrence more than once a week.

The Brazilians handed over to the police on the 20th inst. 160 prisoners, including 11 officers, taken in the recent skirmishes: they were at once set at liberty.

Mme. Demecq de Decoud, mother of the editor of the 'Regeneracion,' was warmly welcomed on her arrival at the capital, after five years of suffering under Lopez.

There were 3916 Brazilians received into hospital from February to Dec. 1869, of which 3400 left cured.

At Villa del Rosario the distress is something awful: women and children die in groups by the roadside, and the survivors bury them, marking the place with wooden crosses. Two vessels left Asuncion on the 19th, one for Concepcion with provisions for the poor, another conveying some women and children to Rosario, with orders to bring down the poor families last rescued from Lopez.

Provisions are promised to be sent to Cerro Leon for distribution among the poor, and small garrisons are ordered to Villa Rica, San Joaquin, &c., to defend those places from bands of Paraguayans. The inhabitants have begun to sow crops, and there is already an abundance of fruit in the market at Asuncion.

Count D'Eu is said to have refused the services of the Indian Caciques who waited on him at Curugaty. The Count is at Villa Rosario, and has sent on the army to Itagami; he is hourly expected at Asuncion en route for Rio Janeiro.

LATEST FROM CORRIENTES.

January 24, 1870.

The Corrientes contingent of the National Guards arrived here yesterday at ten o'clock a.m. Their presence was at once acknowledged and hailed with a salute of cannon. At twelve o'clock they landed at the Resguardia, and were marched directly to the Government House, in the patio of which they bivouacked, or rather rested for a few hours. This building is called the College, as it was built and used by the Jesuits for that purpose in times of old.

The City of Buenos Ayres which was burned near Ibicuy, cost 90,000 pats., and we regret to say was not insured. The Venezia was despatched on Wednesday to bring down the troops she had on board.

Sailors never measure their generosity as even the best of other folk sometimes do. Captain Ramsay, of the Alvaro Gomez, seeing that the unfortunate Paraguayans in and around Lambaré were suffering the greatest want and privation, lately sent them a present of 150 sheep, at his private expense.

From Paraguay we have intelligence of an approaching move on the part of the allies. The Royal Commander-in-Chief is now said to be manoeuvring with the intention of cutting off Lopez's retreat to Bolivia. The Paraguayan ruler now occupies a strong position at Cerro Cara.

A private firm has started a new line of diligences from Cordoba to Salto and promises in a short time to despatch coaches from that city to all the interior provinces. The diligences in connection with the Central Argentine Railway run every day regularly.

The receipts of the National Exchequer for the first nine months of the past year are estimated by a colleague at 3,372,969 hard dollars; the official returns of the Treasury are expected to be published shortly.

A public promenade and garden walk is about to be made at Flores, parallel with the railway line for some distance from the station. This must add greatly to the attractions of this pretty little town.

Our colleagues are loudly complaining of the delay in repairing the mole; the whole structure is falling to pieces; the railing at the end is now so rotten that it threatens to give way each day. If a hurricane and rise in the river were to sweep the whole affair away, it would be a most fortunate circumstance, as another would have to be built 'nolens volens.'

Letters have been received in town from Colonel Mansilla. Everything goes on swimmingly along the Rio Quinto. At Fort Sarmiento the building for the officer's club has been finished, and proves a very comfortable and commodious structure. The rank and file are all under canvas and in the best of health and spirits.

Two of the Indian tribes inhabiting the Chaco, the Vilelas and Sinipies, have for some time been at variance; they came face to face last week, and had a desperate pitched battle, the 'butcher's bill' on both sides being heavy. Both sides were well armed, as the volleys of musketry could be heard distinctly for miles around.

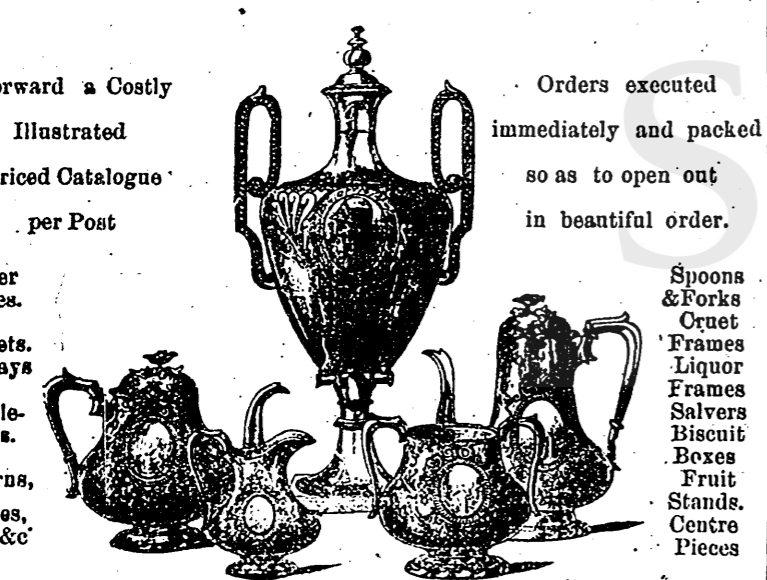
