RAILWAY ACROSS THE ANDES.

MR. WHEELWRIGHT'S STATEMENT TO THE CHILIAN GOVERNMENT.

To His Ex. José Joaquín Pérez, President of the Republic of Chile. In the audience that Your Excellency was pleased to grant me I had the honor to explain some details respecting a railway across the Andes...

Whoever looks back over the past 50 years will be slow to consider my project a chimera. Every year that passes only hastens its realization, and what some may at present pronounce to be a dream will become shortly a fact...

I shall not look upon my labors as sterile if they serve as the basis for carrying out the enterprise.

I am Your Excellency's humble servant.

THE CHILIAN MAILS. KING AURELIE IN ARAUCANIA.

NEW RAILWAYS IN CHILE AND PERU. Valparaiso, Jan. 13th.

The Araucanians are likely to give trouble again: the French adventurer M. Touneau, who styles himself Aurelie Antoine I., is again among them.

I then organized a corps of engineers under Mr. Alexander Campbell, intending to accompany them myself, but at that moment Mr. Allan Campbell had arranged with the Argentine Government for surveying the route for a railway from Rosario and Cordoba...

I submitted all these reports, with the estimates, to the late Admiral Fitzroy, then chief of the Admiralty Department in the Board of Trade at London, who presented the project on January 23rd 1850 to the Royal Geographical Society...

On the 29th August 1853 I submitted my project of a railway over the Andes to a meeting of the British Social Science, as appears from the annals of the Institute.

The reports show the distance from Caldera to Fiambalá to be 322 miles, the height of the latter place being 5,764 ft. above sea-level.

Last year I sent Mr. Edwin Hudson to survey a line from Fiambalá to Punta [near Orqueta], where it would meet the great Central Argentine,

ed by navigable rivers with the Atlantic Ocean. Another new line is being made in Peru, to run from Arequipa to Puno, and thus connect the Pacific with Lake Titicaca.

The troubles in Peru about the Dreyfus loan are not over: Admiral Montero and Sr. Althaus, Director of the Bank of Peru, have been imprisoned.

Bolivia is reduced to such a state of impbecuniosity that it is feared things will come to a dead-lock if President Melgarejo cannot raise a loan of £300,000 sterling.

From Central America we hear that the U. S. corvette Nipsic is making surveys at Aspinwall for a canal across the Isthmus. In Venezuela things are again quiet; the city of Maracaibo delivered up the rebel general, Pulgar, to the Government...

Friday. Mme. Carozzi and Sig. Bonetti are leaving soon, as it appears Pestalardo has failed to come to terms with Mr. Cibille for his new theatre.

The Brazilian Consul General has published a most interesting report of the statistics, finances, industries, &c. of the Republic of Uruguay. He calculates the population at 390,000 inhabitants...

It appears in the last five years no fewer than two million head of cattle have been slaughtered in Montevideo, of which three-fourths for the saladeros and one fourth for the markets.

The Junta of Montevideo issued, in 1869 no fewer than 1,156 licenses to build. D. Isaac Tezanos is going to start another daily paper on the 1st of February.

The Chief of Police has published the regulations for Carnival; no egg-throwing will be allowed. An electric fountain will be inaugurated at the Alcazar masked ball.

Last Monday Sr. Bustamante left Paysandú for San José, to visit Gen. Urquiza; he was accompanied by Gen. Borjes, Colonels Mundell and Moyano, Major Lawless, Captain McEachen, and several others.

The Villa del Salto yesterday brought down \$17,000 and the Saturday to-day \$9,922.

Gold is about 5 1/2 prem. 100 Fomento Fortuna shares sold at \$18. In exchange, yesterday and to-day, there was £16,000 done on England at 52 to 52 1/2, and 371,000 francs at 5.45 to 49 gold; also 22 contos on Rio at 41.000 gold.

The produce market is dull, except in wool in which there have been large transactions at reserved prices. 2,530 dry cow hides at 60 1/2 al barter.

In imports, 1,625 sacks Californian flour for consumption at reserved rates. Large quantities of farina at 75 cents. 250 pipes of wine at 47 1/2 desp.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

The National Government has in view a project to extend the railway system from Cordoba to the upper provinces. A grand line will be made in sections to Jujuy which is our frontier province on Bolivia...

The Recicleta Argentina for January contains a biography of our young friend José Manuel Estrada, by Señor Goyena, an able report on Chile by Santiago Estrada, 'Pesadilla' by the same able author, and some other papers of much interest.

The Rosario police, stimulated by the reward offered by the President of the Republic, for the apprehension of the murderers of Mr. Bold and his servant boy Tait, have captured the perpetrators of that atrocious deed.

The murderer called at Mr. Bold's estancia under pretence of buying sheep and asked leave to stop for the night. At about midnight, when poor Bold was reading in his parlour, they came in suddenly and despatched him by dagger thrusts and blows of a hatchet...

Part of the reward offered by H. E. has been paid to the parties who arrested the murderers, and it now remains for the tribunals of Santa Fé to do their duty and condemn these men to their fate.

The French mail steamer Amazone sails to-day with the general European mails. The Packet Edition of the STANDARD can be had till noon at Loedels in Calle San Martin.

We have been requested to state that the mails for the Arica route were forwarded from this city on the 24th as per notice, and no supplementary despatch will be advertised or forwarded by the Post-office.

The works on the new telegraph line from Rosario to Santa Fé had to be stopped within a short distance of the latter city in consequence of the supply of wire falling short.

A ship has just arrived from England with another hundred miles of wire, and the works have been resumed, and are expected to be completed to Santa Fé in a short time.

The decree issued by the Vice President and countersigned by the War Minister, abolishing the compulsory service on the frontier by the National Guards has given great satisfaction in the country districts.

The total contingent asked from the fourteen provinces is only 2,560 men. Vice President Alsina has always been an earnest advocate for the abolition of the law compelling the Nat. Guards to serve on the frontiers, and he has certainly lost no time, the reins of power once in his hands, in carrying out his pet project.

Madame Carozzi and Signor Bonetti so long and favourably known to the River Plate public will soon, it is said, leave for Europe.

The President of the Republic published in the local papers a grateful and gracious farewell to the people of Rosario, on leaving for Entre Rios, H. E. regretted not being able to take a personal leave of those who had visited him in consequence of the state of his health, and the limited time at his disposal.

A number of the unfortunate families who lately returned to Asuncion, have found some resources in the jewels and plate which they had entrusted to foreigners to keep for them on the outbreak of the war. In nearly every case the trust has been faithfully kept, and the valuables restored to their lawful owners.

A plot to assassinate President Moreno, was discovered in Quito on

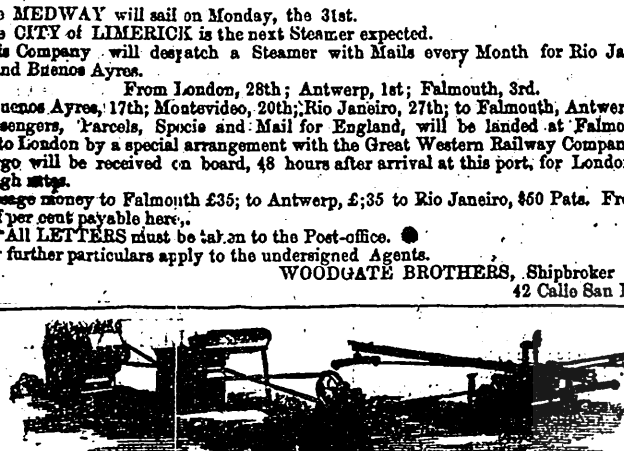
