THE BRITISH HOSPITAL, MONTEVIDEO.

In the year 1857 it was found to be necessary to provide special Hospital accommodation in this city for our fellow-countrymen. A Building, affording a sufficient number of Wards to meet our wants et that time was accordingly rented, and furnished with all the usual appliances. But in the year 1865, from the vast increase which had taken place in the number of vessels frequenting the Port, this Building became so over-crowded, that, on the appearance of an Infectious disease, it was felt that the lives of the patients were seriously ondangered, while many applications for admission could not be entertained by the Committee. It was then resolved to put forth a special effort to procure larger and more suitable premises, and for this purpose an Appeal for Funds was made to the British residents, and was by them most liberally met. had taken place in the number of vessels fre-

berally met.

A site was then purchased and a Building orected on it, furnishing Beds for Fifty Patients, besides Rooms for a Superintendent and Matron, a Surgery, and all the usual Offices; while it was so constructed that, should a necessity arise was so constructed that, should a necessity arise at a future day, additional wards can be added at a trifling expense. We have thus an Hospital, in all respects, admirably adapted to meet our necessities, and incurring expenses for general management never exceeding our annual in-The total cost of site and building has been

The total cost of site and building has been thirty six thousand dollars, of which sum twenty-one thousand have been paid, leaving a deficit of fifteen thousand dollars. This sum has been lent to the Committee at interest by several British residants; but, with a community so small, and continuing to support their other Institutions, and that during a period of severe commercial and monetary distress, it is hopeless to expect to pay it off without assistance from other quarters.

The Committee propose to hold a Bazaar in September, 1870, and they make a general appeal for contributions of money, and of useful and ornamental articles, suitable for sale, believing that when it is seen that the British residents in this City have not been backward to help themselves, but that 'they have been willing to their power, yea, and beyond their power. to their power, yea, and beyond their power; and the Comimttee trust this Appeal will be met by every men with a generous and liberal respense.


