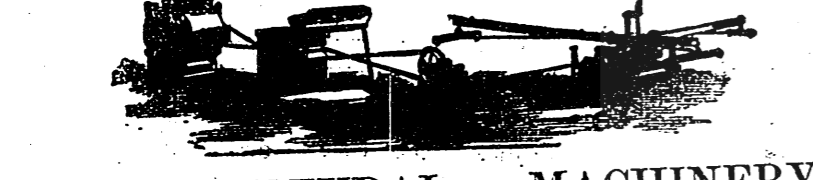

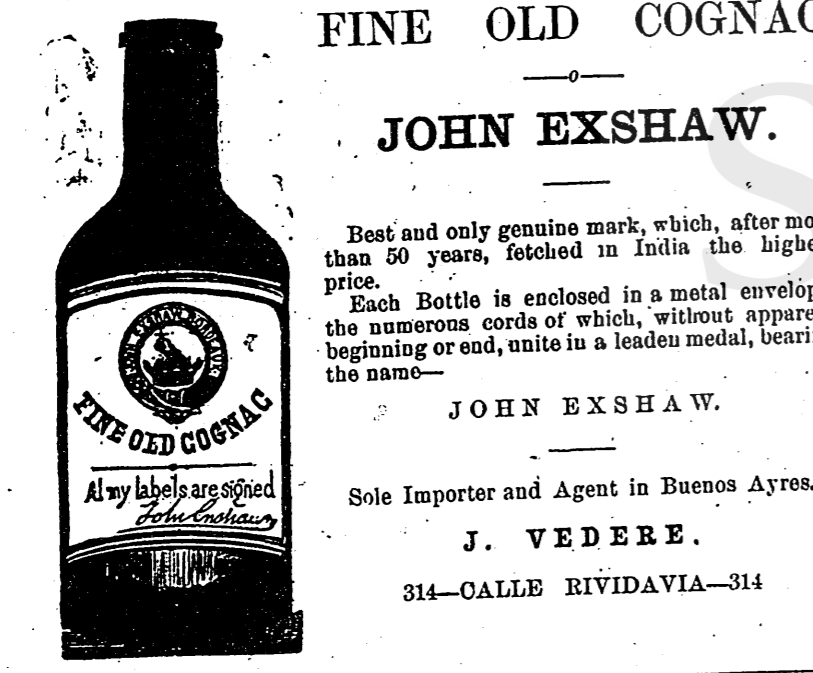

STATUTES OF THE CERRITO COLONISATION AND AGRICULTURAL JOINT-STOCK COMPANY.

Art. 1. The object in view is to cultivate and colonize the Lands belonging to Mr. J. J. Puzos, in the Cerrito, Department of Paraná, Province of Entre Rios, Argentine Republic.

Art. 2. The Capital is \$125,000 (£25,000 sterling) divided into 125 Shares of \$1,000 (£200 sterling) each, numbered 1 to 125, of which the proprietor, Mr. Lieste, represents 80, as the value of the Lands to be cultivated and apportioned to Colonists.

Art. 4. The 80 Shares of Mr. Lieste, has hypothecated his lands to guarantee for the payment and amortization of the 125 Shares created, and this Mortgage was signed at Buenos Ayres on the 10th of August, 1870.

Art. 5. The amount of the Shares to be made out of the proceeds of Farm Lots sold, the Titles for same being signed by Mr. Lieste and the Manager of the Branch Bank at Buenos Ayres, and the amount, and the Lots to be sold being those of all responsibility or lien whatever. The Manager of the Branch Bank shall remit all such sums to the Argentine Bank at Buenos Ayres, and on \$5,000 are collected, a Lottery shall be made of the Shares 1 to 110, and three drawn for Amortisation, and so on. The remaining 15 Shares of Mr. Lieste hereafter to be kept as a guarantee, of which hereafter.

Art. 6. Each of the Shares Amortised, as in Art. 5, shall also receive a premium of 8 per cent, per annum.

Art. 7. The Company will last for three years, from February 1st, 1870.

Art. 8. At the end of three years the Company shall be wound up, and the remaining Shares Amortised, and the surplus divided 'pro rata' among the Shareholders. Mr. Lieste guarantees this surplus to pay 12 1/2 per cent on each Share; and as security deposits the same in the Argentine Bank, Buenos Ayres.

Art. 9. Mr. John J. M. Lieste is responsible Director and Manager of the Company; he is to receive no salary, but a third of the net profit of the Company, until the liquidation.

Art. 10. The Managing Director shall keep his Books in due form, so as to show his balances at the meetings, as laid down in Articles 11 and 12. The Books shall always be at the disposal of the Shareholders to examine whenever they think fit.

Art. 11. In the first two months of each year the Managing Director shall report to the Shareholders to report to them the progress and condition of the Company's affairs; and two months before the expiration of the term of three years, he shall call a General Meeting to present a general statement of the condition of the Company, and devise steps either for finally winding it up as in Art. 8, or for prolonging the Company for a new term, if it seems desirable.

Art. 12.
