

Few can imagine the inconvenience caused within the last few days by the stoppage of the water-supply; all the water carts had, as in days of old, to go to the river. The horses unaccustomed to such a fatiguing journey, owing to the convenience of the cocks in the plazas, etc., gave up, and hundreds of water carts lay in the most belpless condition on the river side. Again, the watermen raised their charges, and families depending on river water had to disburse ten dollars a day for one of the most necessary articles of life. Again, the staff of workmen under the committee is so miserably deficient in number, that one has to wait months and months to get the water introduced from the street into a dwelling house, whilst the charges are on a scale which completely eclipses the Gas Company. The late difficulty will, however, have one good effect in attracting more attention to the subject; the mouth of the pipe in the river should certainly have a fender to keep fishes, etc., from entering; the late corruption of the water was simply attributable to neglecting this. In the pipes were found millions of defunct shell and other fish This can be most easily avoided; the color seems to baffle science, although perhaps an improved system of filtration might also remové it. We trust Dr. Weiss will attend to this, as it is a most important matter.

PARISH AND SANTA MARIA.

EIGHT SHOTS PIRED. Yesterday between 2 and 3 o'clock in the afternoon Mr. Frank Parish British Consul, and Mr. Constant Santa Maria, Railway Director, had a most miraculous escape from being shot down by some party or parties unknown. 
