Annual Report.

The following is a resumé of the transactions in this market during the

The imports, 925,838, show a falling off as compared with 1868 of 152,280 bides of all classes,

of 203,025. The direct trausit, 280,182, shows an increase of 5,552.

As will be seen by the above figures transactions have been of considerable 50,000 and 100,000 hides.

The year began with a large stock on hands, consisting for the most part of long-haired salted ox-hides, which had arrived late in the previous season, and the realization of this stock siderable sacrifices on the part of holders. From this period prices remained firm, and the fair cargoes from Buenos Ayres averaged 61 to 611t, those from Uruguay and Montevideo 591 to 60, the demand being constantly steady.

Salted cow bides did not experience any violent fluctuations in value. The fall of from two to three francs, quoted great success. in spring, was regained in summer, the demand being very good in July and August, when the stock was almost reduced to nothing; at present they are weakly held, and the demand of Saladero Cow Hides reaches us a little too late in the season.

Dry ox hides have experienced much the same fluctuations in value as salta! ed. An accumulation of stock and a fall of from 12 to 15 francs in January and June, afterwards a partial recovery of from three to six francs, and at present steady, with freesale for lots not exceeding 13-14 kilos,

Dry cow hides, slightly neglected in spring, became in great demand in September, after the auctions in Germany, and experienced a rise of from four to five francs on January prices; since that date the demand has fallen off for these sorts and prices are weaker.

Dry hides of inferior quality were generally in demand and met with a ready sale, particularly 'desechos' of good shape and kind. Cordova and large hides in general were also easily sold, owing to the scarcity of Rio Grande dry hides, the want of which is much felt.

The quality of the hides received this year has been on the whole good, but very little heating being observable in either dry hides or those from the saladeros. We must, however, remark with regret that matadero dry hides are no longer as free from traces of the knife as they were two years ago. We have received many complaints on the subject. We have to add that in some cargoes of salted Uruguay hides, chiefly cow's, a small proportion of scarred hides of a particular shape were found, which were probably from the knackers' yards of the town or the army. 


