ARTWEP HIDE MARKET.

Annual Report. The following is a resumé of the transactions in this market during the past year:—

The imports, 925,838, show a falling off as compared with 1868 of 152,280 hides of all classes.

The sales, 806,401, show an increase of 203,025.

The direct transit, 280,182, shows an increase of 5,552.

As will be seen by the above figures transactions have been of considerable magnitude during the past year, the monthly sales fluctuating between 50,000 and 100,000 hides.

The year began with a large stock on hands, consisting for the most part of long-haired salted ox-hides, which had arrived late in the previous season, and the realization of this stock proved difficult and necessitated considerable sacrifices on the part of holders.

On the other hand the regular arrivals of new hides from the saladeros moved off with ease, often at the moment when landed; the prices realised, however, were but seldom remunerative for importers, as they had to submit to rates current in other markets, which at the opening of the sales were 60¢ for Buenos Ayres ox, and 60.62¢ for Spanish, which was a fall of about 6¢ on quotations current at the beginning of the year.

From this period prices remained firm, and the fair cargoes from Buenos Ayres averaged 61¢ to 61½¢, those from Uruguay and Montevideo 59½¢ to 60¢, the demand being constantly steady.
