The world, we are told, is now cosmopolitan; "it matters not where a man is born; where he lives is his country." But they know nothing of human nature who assert such nonsense. We may have every feeling of respect and attachment for our adopted country, but we all somehow have love and affection for our native land. The materialists of the hour may deride such sentiments, but we respect them; and no grievance, no abuse can justify any want of respect to susceptibilities and cient as they are honorable.

Our colleague El Rio de la Plata has either through ignorance or misapprehension thought proper to associate the STANDARD and the Courrier de la Plata with Sr. Blanco del Valle and his insults. We recel the charge in toto, and beg that our contemporary will rectify his assertions. Even the translation of our remarks on the escape of prisoners from the Carcel, and the impunity for murder which exists, has been tortured; we asserted, and repeat it, that neither our Policia or Tribunals are up to the mark, and that the impunity for crime which exists lessens the guarantees for life and property that should be in every civilized community. Every upright Argentine we believe will bear us out in these remarks. As to shipping the convicted assassins to Mozambique, we see nothing objectionable in the plan (which was proposed by the Tribuna of Montevideo) since capital punishment although ordained by law is not enforced. Touching the return of the National Guards through the provinces, we know nothing beyoud the statements that appeared in other newspapers, from which we copied; there is nothing in any of this that can or ought to be classed with a gratuitous national insult; our efforts are merely to reform abuses. The Tribuna, Nacional and Rio de la Plata have spoken in much harder and more unbridled terms than we have, and perhaps, if the editor of the Rio de la Plata were less imperfectly acquainted

Rio, may interest our mercantile and shipping public: --

The British ship Leon Crespo, bound for Valparaiso, arrived here upon the 18th of August last, having put in with her cargo of coals in a smoking condition and supposed to be on fire. By the Captain's order the vessel was scuttled

and sunk, but after a few dilys was raised. At the request of the Captain and H. B.M.'s Consul (also consignee of the vessel), a survey was held, and the cargo being condomned as unfit to be reshipped, it was sold at a very low price. The vessel having suffered some injury, by the scuttling, she was put under regairs, and, to enable her to put to sea, to return to England a bottomry of 55,000\$ was advertised for,

However, Commander Stunders arrived in Rio, with full powers from the owners, and from Lloyd's Salvage company, with which the vessel was insured. Ur. Saunders at once brought up against the Captain the grave charges of having needlessly desisted from his voyage, of having needlessly sold his cargo, of having put extravacant repairs on the vessel, and of trying unnecessarily, to mise a bottomry without communicating with the owners.

Commander Saunders then called for a Naval Court of enquiry into the conduct of the Captain, which Captain Buckley the senior British naval officer on the station granted, and appointed as President of it Captain Pearce of H. M.'s storeship Egmont. This court was to be composed of two naval officers, one merchant and one merchant Captain.

Mr. Thomas Hollocombe was the merchant summoned, and the merchant captain was Captain M. J. Llewellyn, of the British ship Arizona, bound with coal for Bombay, who put in upon the 26th ult., to effect some needful repairs to his


