RESULT OF THE CENSUS.

The report of the Census Commissioners gives us a minute and carefully compiled table of the population of the City and Province of Buenos Ayres and of the other 13 Provinces of the Republic. We can take in at a glance a world of useful information, and learn those facts which are most undeniable because based on figures.

The mortality of the city is returned at 6,000 persons yearly, showing an average of 1 in 32 inhabitants, or one-fourth more than in London.

San Juan has 60,319, including 8,000 for the city. Education is even more advanced than in Buenos Ayres, being as 1 pupil to 10 inhabitants.

Jujuy has the smallest population of any Province only 40,362, including 3,000 for the city and 6,000 for the town of Ledesma and 11 small villages.

Mendoza has 65,413, including 8,000 for the city, and 2,000 for 4 villages. Educational ratio 1 in 26.

San Luis has 53,294, including 4,000 for the city and 8,000 for 10 villages. Educational ratio 1 in 19.

Rioja has 48,746, including 4,000 for the city and 8,000 for 5 villages. Educational ratio 1 in 23.

Cordoba has the largest population after Buenos Ayres, counting 210,508 inhabitants, of whom 28,000 live in the city, 5,000 at the town of Rio Cuarto, and 14,000 in 8 smaller towns.

Santiago del Estero has 132,898, including 20,000 in 5 towns, the largest of which is Salavina, and then comes Santiago. Education is much neglected; the ratio being 1 in 29.

Catamarca has 79,962 inhabitants of whom only one-fourth live in the country, and the rest in towns viz. Tinogasta, Belen, Piedra Blanca, Andalgalá, Valle Viejo, Catamarca, Alto, and 5 smaller towns.

Entre-Rios has 134,235, being an increase of 32 per cent. since 1861. This province, like Catamarca, abounds in large towns; viz. Parana, Gualeguaychú, Gualeguay, Concordia, Victoria, La Paz, Concepcion and 7 other places, in all making up 64,000 inhabitants.

Salta has 88,933, including 12,000 for the city and 9,000 for Oran, Lerma, and 12 villages. This Province has lost 10 per cent. since 1865, but this is explained by the fact that the present Census does not include 29,000 Indians of Oran and Bermejo.

Corrientes has 129,023, including 10,000 for the city, 4,000 for Goya, and 24,000 for 18 villages. It is calculated that 6,000 men and women followed the baggage train of the army into Paraguay, but on the other hand 12,000 Paraguayan women and children have taken refuge in this province.

The Commissioners return a total of 1,736,922 persons enrolled, to which they add 90,000 for Indians, 6,220 for the Army, and 67,000 for omissions.

THE JORDAN WAR.

The tactics of the Entre Riano liberators are each day becoming more ambiguous, in fact none but a very experienced 'vaqueno' can follow the movements of Richard L. Jordan, for the geographies give up just a few leagues beyond the last battle-field, called the Willows.

Along the sedgy banks of an arroyo not marked upon any map, Jordan for the last few days has been marching the remnant of his army. According to the latest despatches received at

Gualeguaychú, Jordan has been falling back in a north-easterly direction, that is to say he is striking from the confines of Victoria across the province of his birth, his passion, and his crime, and making towards Concordia.

But in these countries it is impossible to form a correct judgment on such matters, so much depends upon contingencies (not contingents.) Jordan evidently aims at joining Tim. Aparicio in the Banda Oriental; a special message to that effect was sent the other day from Gualeguaychú to Fray Bentos to notify the authorities.

The movements of Jordan at the moment, therefore, are of high interest; he has evidently got the start of Conesa in the race to the river; but the National Government troops in the towns on the river's banks can easily intercept his passage.

It is, after all, a matter of high moment for Argentine politicians, the Jordan question. The Entre Riano affair was a bubble which burst at the time appointed; but if the scenes are to be now changed, and we are to follow Jordan into the Republic of Uruguay, the struggle then admits of but one issue, namely, Banda Oriental independence.

In the Chamber of Deputies Sr. Araujo Lima has brought in a bill to declare free all future births among the slaves. EDITOR'S TABLE.

Our colleagues the Capital of Rosario, and the Oriental of Montevideo, have simultaneously proposed our distinguished friend Hector F. Varela as futuro Governor of Entre Rios.

Messrs. Wanklyn & Co.'s new banking premises were opened yesterday. They are much more roomy than those previously occupied. The business of this bank has so much increased of late that it was found necessary to enlarge the premises, and at first it was intended to throw the whole front of the building into the banking offices, but owing to the construction of the house this was found impossible.

During the prevalence of yellow fever in this city, 33 patients were received into the Lazaretto; of these, 16, one half, died. The first case was on the 30th March, the last on the 18th of May.

Of the 627 passengers brought out to Buenos Ayres by the Savoia, not a single one was even indisposed during the voyage: they all landed in perfect health on the 11th. This fact speaks volumes for the management of this popular line.

Mr. Musters, R. N. has arrived at Bahía Blanca from Point Arenas, Straits of Magellan, with some Obeluchelos Indians who bring news of the Welsh Colonists up to August of last year: there were some fears about their fate, but we are happy to have cheering accounts. The Cacique sent an Indian from Zalencos, who made the journey in 12 days and brought back a letter from Mr. Hughes, stating that Mr. Jones has not yet arrived. The Indian says the colonists gave him good bread, butter and cheese, but no tobacco or yerba.

The alarm about the cattle plague is subsiding. It is said a large proportion of the animals attacked have recovered, and for the last few days the Basque milkmen from Flores are to be seen galloping into and about town as usual with their unwillingly looking cans well filled. The supply of sound milk is as yet, however, limited, and it is surmised that the pump contributes at least 50 per cent. of the consumption.

A letter to the Sociedad Rural from Rosario says:—that a wash composed of perchloride of iron in a liquid state in the proportion of one sixteenth with pure water, is an unfailing cure for the disease, the animal being fed meanwhile on alfalfa, over which a little salt has been sprinkled, and only allowed to drink well-water with half an ounce of sulphate of iron dissolved in every 100 litres of it. This is a very cheap remedy and the hint may be of use to our numerous readers in the camp.

A communication from Santiago refers to the existence of an unknown metal in the Chaco under the most fantastic forms, and extending over a distance of sixty leagues. It is met with oftentimes in the shape of trunks of old trees, mounds, pyramids, and long bars of twenty-five yards in length. To remove one of the latter, imbedded in the earth, a large barrel of gunpowder was exploded in vain. The existence of iron deposits in the Chaco has long been admitted by scientific men, and the National Government would do well to order a thorough exploration of this region in order to set all doubts at rest as to the nature and value of the metal, whatever it may be.

An emigrant vessel arrived at Rosario some days ago having had no fewer than twenty fatal cases of small pox on board. There was great alarm in the town when this news was known and the ship was at once sent up the river in quarantine. The exhibition materials are being landed at this port.

The increasing number of marriages amongst all classes has been for some time a subject of remark in the metropolis, and we find the list of these ceremonies in the provincial papers increasing remarkably. The most celebrated economists agree in thinking the increase of marriages, particularly amongst the less affluent classes, as one of the best, and most reliable signs of a country's advancement and prosperity.

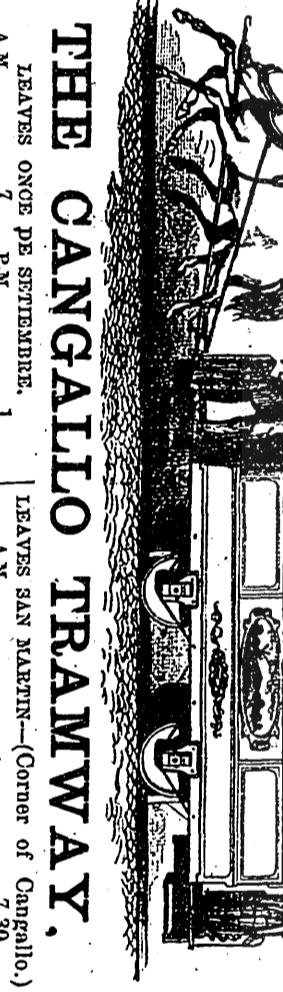
